The Perkins house is hidden at left. The Elmwood Hotel was purchased for the Canadian Navy about 1942, during World War Two, and used as living quarters and offices for naval personnel whose ships were undergoing refit at the plant of Thompson Machinery Co. Ltd. After the war (in 1949) the old Elmwood was torn down and its site is now a lawn in front of the artillery training quarters.
