### Professional Services Contract: Zanzibar, Tanzania

I am writing with reference to the above contract and the correspondence between Dalhousie and ICOD concerning the nature of the proposal process.

The original letter announcing the proposed project with the University of Dar-es-Salaam is dated May 16, 1990. Following discussion with ICOD officials and the relevant University departments, I replied to the proposal in a letter dated July 18, 1990 raising the following issues:

- (a) institutional development requires a partnership between institutions, not contracted services;
- (b) the project as designed does not permit adequate scope for professional inputs by the institutional partners/participants;
- (c) the project calls for specifies inputs by time and task and provides no basis for the adequacy of these inputs in relationship to the objectives nor any basis for judging the adequacy of the objectives in relation to IMS needs.

To date, we have had no reply to my July 18 letter. The official proposal call requires four copies of the proposal bid by March 4, (including yellow sticker), providing that we had written to you by February 19, 1991 but does not answer the questions raised in my letter nor provide further relevant information about the recipient institution.

I have deliberately not written to you on behalf of Dalhousie by February 19. Given your statement "Failure to confirm your intent by this date will remove your institution from consideration under this proposal call", I am assuming that Dalhousie has now been excluded from consideration.

We feel strongly that we cannot participate in an institution building project which is designed as this one is. I do believe that the issues raised in my earlier letter are ones worthy of further discussion, independent of a specific project. Therefore, I would like to propose a discussion between ICOD, Dalhousie and possibly other universities for this purpose.

I hope you will find this proposal of interest and look forward to your response.
