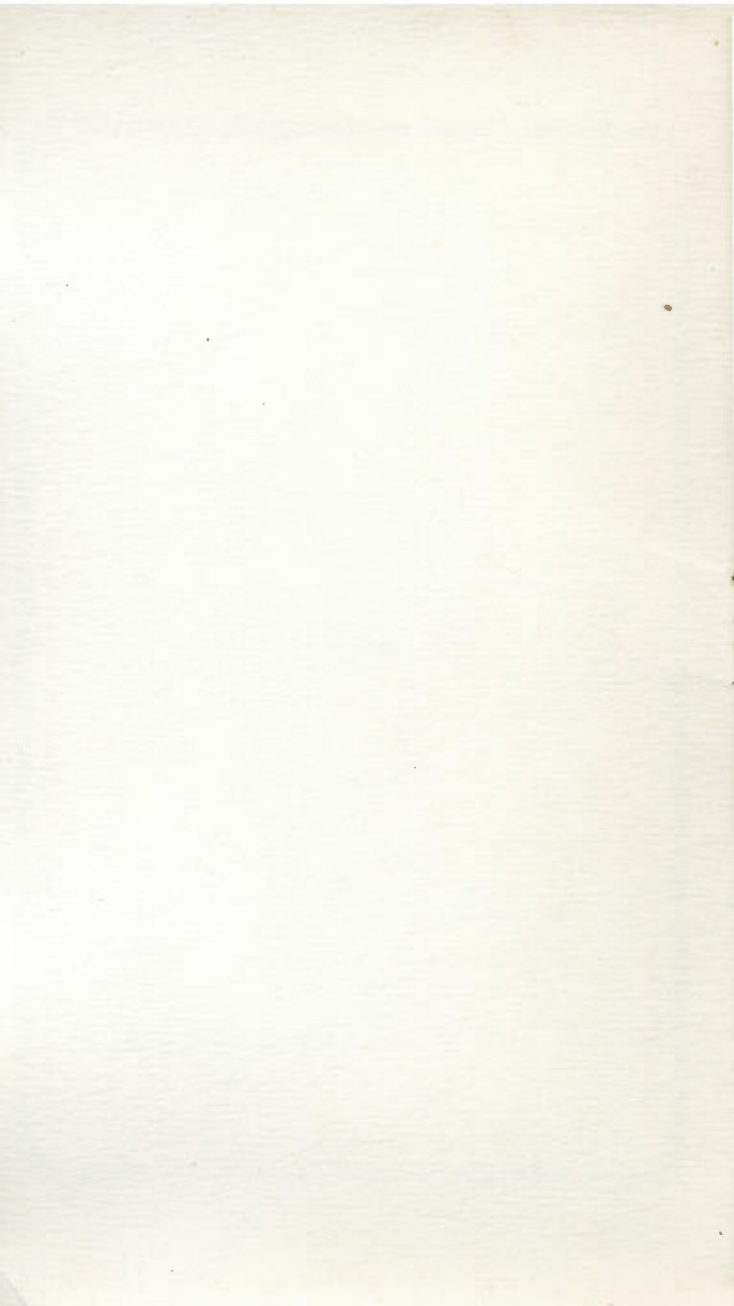

1. A Dominion Board of Pharmacy to be appointed consisting of one representative from each province.

2. Said Board to be empowered to grant certificates of Dominion registration, and be required to keep a register of all holders of the same. Such certificates to entitle holders to register and become members of any provincial association and to practice pharmacy thereunder subject to the same fee as ordinary members.

3. The following to be the requirements for Dominion registration :

(1) General educational qualifications : Matriculation into any University or Medical College of Canada.

(2) Professional qualifications. (a) Examination of Dominion Board, or (b) Ph.G. diploma of recognized colleges. The foregoing with ten year's experience in retail pharmacy in Canada ; or (c) Twenty years's experience in retail pharmacy in Canada."

(2) Payment of such fee to Dominion Board as may be determined.

"That C. Ph. A. be incorporated."

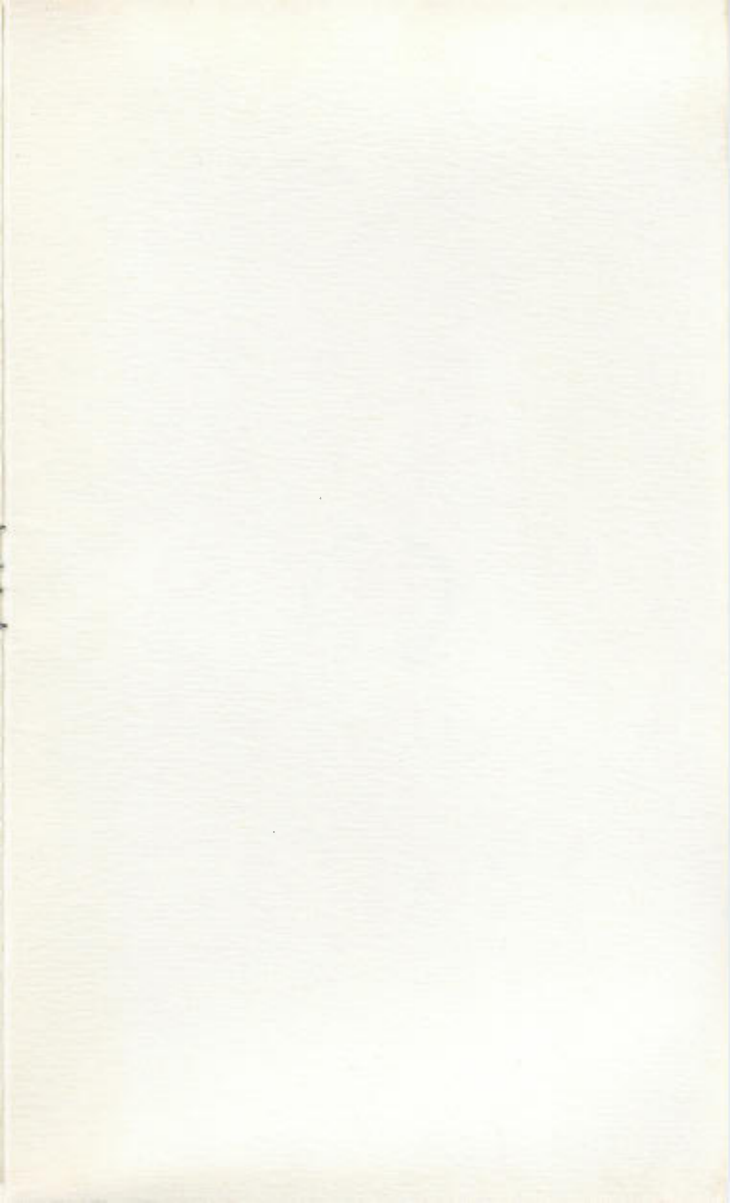

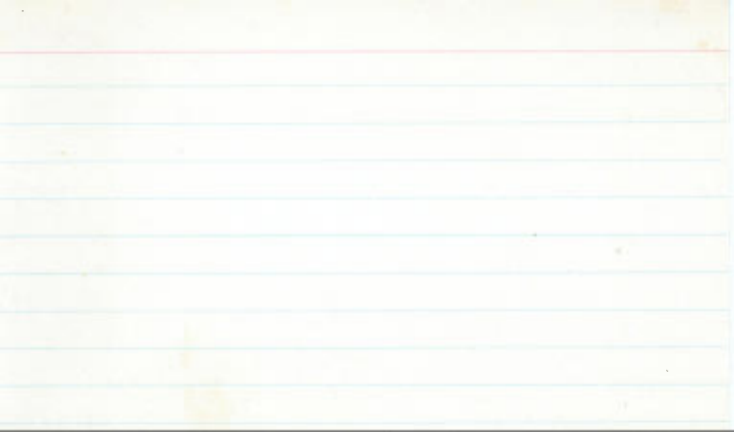

"Dr. Jackson came into the laboratory, where there were several pupils variously engaged in scientific research, and announcing the important discovery, and asked who would volunteer to make some chloroform. This was in Dec 1847, & at that time there was probably not an ounce of chloroform in the U.S.A." - -

"all of the students adjourned to the front
office, Thurs, Dec 30, 1847, when Dr. Jackson
proposed to administer the chloroform to any
one who would venture to take it. As we
had made it, the honor of first respiring it was
accorded, and we were soon rendered

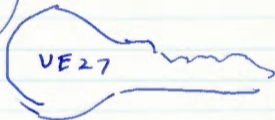

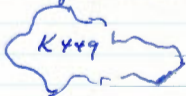

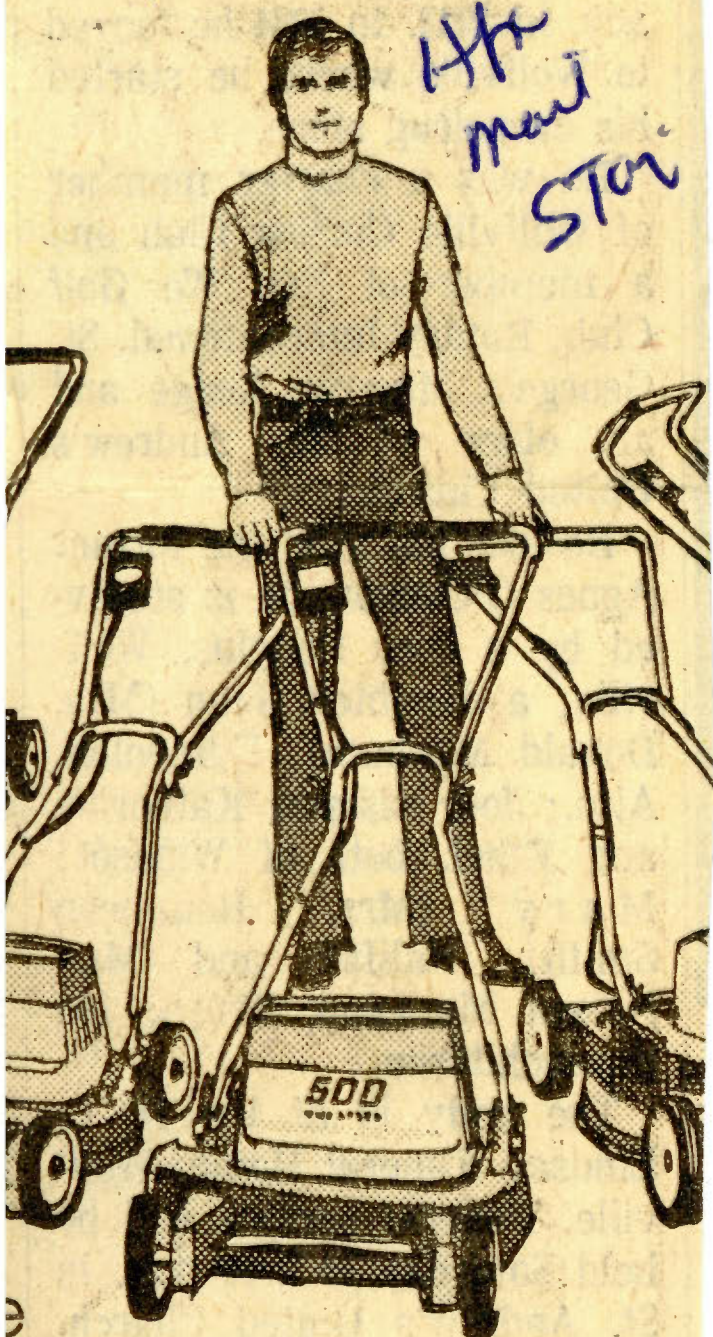

above the dispensing counters. Lighting is modern and attractive, and the whole store gives a sense of spaciousness, patrons having every opportunity to move about and make selection from the well displayed stock.

This roominess also extends to the lunch counter which runs nearly the whole length of one side of the store.

On the drug side there is a staff of eight and on the counter, or fountain side five are employed. The idea is to run the store as much as possible on a departmental basis. In the dispensary are Victor Hyson, A. I. Dalzell and Mrs. C. Martin. L. B. Woodhouse, formerly associated with the dispensary at Camp Hill Hospital, is in charge of the merchandising departments.

NEW STORE FOR BALCOM-CHITTICK

The drug firm of Balcom-Chittick Limited, which has 11 stores in Nova Scotia bearing the name of the company, nine of them in Halifax, and with the others at Kentville and Sheet Harbor, are now occupying fine new premises at Armdale. When the building in which they had so long operated their Armdale Pharmacy was taken over some time ago, under a beautification plan for the head of the inter-



nationally famous Northwest Arm, it became necessary for the firm to find new quarters.

Under expansion plans of the Acadia Stores, a food chain, a new store was being erected just across the intersection, and arrangements were completed with the head of the Acadia firm to

He was re-elected by acclamation in 1939 and again defeated Mr. Kitchen last January to retain the chief magistrate's post. He was chosen to represent York County on the Conservative side of the provincial House in the general election last Nov. 20 and just prior to the opening session of the Legislature was proclaimed the leader's choice for Conservative premier in which office he served through the present session.

Mayor Forbes is president of the Fredericton Exhibition Ltd., a member of the Victoria Public Hospital board of trustees and a member of the Fredericton branch of the Canadian Legion.

Mayor Forbes is married and has two children, a boy and a girl. His only brother, Robert Forbes, has been commissioned second lieutenant with the First Battalion of the Carleton and York Regiment and will leave Fredericton Monday for training. He was given a farewell party at D-Coy Inn, on the St. John River, a few miles above the city.

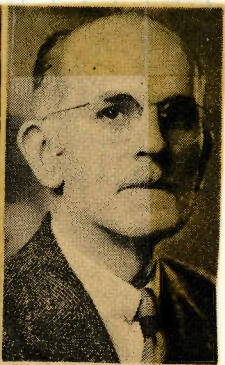

Hon. L. Gardner Passes Yarmouth, N.S., August 23

Hon. L. C. Gardner, member from Yarmouth to the Provincial Legislature since 1928 and speaker since 1933 died at his summer home at Deerfield at noon, August 23rd.

Attending physicians attributed Mr. Gardner's death to the ravages of Bright's disease. Mr. Gardner was 62 years of age having been born at Yarmouth, December 27, 1875. He was one of the best known citizens and politicians in the Province.

Mr. Gardner was a graduate of the Brooklyn College of Pharmacy, New York, having graduated as an honour student and medal winner. He opened his drug business in 1905 and continued until 1934. In 1918 he had become a director of Minard's Liniment Company Ltd., and in 1929 became the President and managing director.

Mr. Gardner first entered politics in 1925 and in 1928 won his provincial election. The following year he was appointed chief whip for the Liberal party. In 1933 he was re-elected with the largest majority recorded in the Province and was made speaker by his government. He belonged to Central United Church and was a member of Hiram Lodge No. 12 A.F. & A.M. and was a charter member of the Royal Arcanum. Mr. Gardner served on many directorates, was a former president of the Nova Scotia Pharmaceutical Society, a former examiner for the Province and was a member of the Canadian Parliamentary Association. The interment was in Mountain Cemetery following a private service at his late home and a public service in Central United Church.

DEATH OF MR. J. B. HATTIE

Mr. James B. Hattie, of the former firm of Hattie & Mylius, but which is now a branch of the National Drug and Chemical Co., died suddenly at his home at Halifax, Nova Scotia, March 1st. Mr. Hattie was in apparently good health up to that time, but during the preceding evening complained of pressure of the chest. Death was due to neuralgia of the heart.

Mr. J. B. Hattie was one of the most prominent and progressive business men in Halifax. He was forty-three years of age and a native of Pictou County, N.S., and has been engaged in the drug business since 1880. In 1887 he joined Mr. L. J. Mylius in the purchase of the Eagar drug business of that city and under the firm name of Hattie & Mylius continued in business until the recent drug merger, Mr. Hattie being made manager of the Halifax branch of the new company, Mr. Mylius being appointed to Ottawa.

He was a general favorite in social, as well as in business circles, and his funeral which took place on the 3rd inst. was the largest seen in Halifax in many years. Mr. Hattie leaves a widow, a son and two daughters.

**FORMER C.Ph.A. PRESIDENT
PASSES IN NOVA SCOTIA**

On January 23, 1965, Elisha Dimock Hines, pharmacist of Bridgewater, Nova Scotia, passed away.

Mr. Hines was born at Isaac's Harbour, N.S. on Jan. 2, 1900, the son of Benjamin Elisha and Mary Elizabeth Hines. Other positions held were Past President, Navy League (Bridgewater Branch), Past President, Board of Trade and Past Master of the Masonic Lodge.

Years Established

Fredericton, N.B.—The transfer of title of the drug business known as Hunt & MacDonald, Fredericton, to the Ross Drug Company Limited, Saint John, has been made. This transfer marks the passing of the business from the possession of the family of its founder after seventy-eight years continuous family ownership.

The business was established in the year 1852 by the late George C. Hunt. Mr. Hunt was born in England and received his early education there. He came to Canada when young and received his pharmaceutical training in Boston, Mass. At the time of its opening in 1852 the business was known as George C. Hunt Jr. and a short time later a Mr. Chaloner was taken in as a partner, which combine, however, lasted but a short time. For many years Mr. Hunt was the sole proprietor until he took into partnership S. A. R. MacDonald who was head clerk in the store at the time. From that time until the present the establishment has been known as Hunt & MacDonald. In 1911 the junior partner resigned from the firm, shortly after the death of Mr. Hunt. Since the passing of its founder the concern has been owned solely by a daughter, Miss Ella P. Hunt.

The store still contains many of its original furnishings, including the solid mahogany counters, mahogany wall drawers with hand painted lettering, and a pair of solid brass balance-scales. The last mentioned piece of equipment is in perfect working order and of a quality of brass and workmanship not procurable at present. From time to time they have attracted considerable attention, especially from tourists who have patronized the store.

OBITUARY

1st we were able to print the news of Col. MacKenzie's death. The following will give more details of the funeral.

One of the Miramichi's oldest and most highly respected residents, Col. J. D. B. F. MacKenzie, passed away at his home in Chatham at eleven o'clock Saturday morning, August 27th, after several weeks' illness. His passing cast a deep gloom over the town of Chatham, where he had made his home for almost sixty years, residents, both young and old, feeling they had sustained a personal loss in the death of the veteran druggist and military man. He was a man of upright character and engaging personality, and the sympathy of many friends is being extended to the family in their great loss.

Col. James Daniel Benjamin Fraser MacKenzie was born in Pictou, Nova Scotia, on March 5th, 1855, and was thus in his eighty-fourth year. He was a graduate of the Presbyterian Academy at Pictou, and in 1879 came to Chatham, where he carried on a successful drug business ever since. He was a member of the Chatham School Board since incorporation, and a former member of the Board of Directors of Dalhousie University, Halifax. He was also one of the founders of the Miramichi Natural History Association and took an active interest in this phase of his activities up to the time of his death. Col. MacKenzie joined the Canadian Militia at the time of the Reil Rebellion in 1878-79, and was active till retirement in 1920.

The late Colonel was the founder and first president of the N. B. Pharmaceutical Society, and also president on the 50 Anniversary and past president of the Canadian Pharmaceutical Association. He was also a Past Grand Master of the Masonic Lodge and Oddfellows, a member of the Rebekahs and an honorary member of the Highland Society.

Masonic and military honors were paid at the funeral of the late Col. Mackenzie on Monday afternoon. There were six honorary pallbearers: Col. A. L. Barry, Newcastle; Lt.-Col. Cuthbert Donald, Blackville; Lt.-Col. H. S. Murray, Lt.-Col. A. J. Losier, M.D., Chatham; Lt.-Col. E. J. White, Bathurst; and Major J. A. Leger, Newcastle. Pallbearers, six past grand masters of the Masonic Lodge, were H. B. MacDonald, R. A. Snowball, H. H. Simmonds, E. S. Jack, Chatham; C. D. Dickison, Newcastle, and W. J. C. Scott, Loggieville.

The funeral service at the home

was conducted by Rev. Dr. F. H. Holmes, assisted by the choir of the United Church. The North Shore Regimental Band headed the procession, and a firing party gave the salute at the grave. G. P. Burchill, Nelson, past grand master, assisted by Archdeacon Thomas Parker, chaplain, conducted the Masonic service at the grave. In addition to relatives and personal friends and acquaintances, many private citizens paid their last respects, with the Chatham School Board, Newcastle Town Council, Miramichi Hospital Board, Highland Society, Pharmaceutical Societies being among those officially represented. The New Brunswick Pharmaceutical Society was represented by Messrs. W. H. Bryden, Registrar, W. W. McAuley, Treasurer, E. R. W. Ingraham and James Munro, all of St. John.

Many members of the drug trade in Canada, and particularly in his home province of Nova Scotia, will hear with a sense of real sorrow of the passing at Halifax of one of its well known druggists, James Robert McFatridge. The

discovered at his home Saturday, Nov. 20, and Dr. Woodbury, Medical Examiner, said that the passing of the esteemed Gottingen Street drug store operator had occurred two days before and was due to natural causes.

Mr. McFatridge's passing is particularly distressing in that he had only shortly before been discharged from the Victoria General Hospital, and was living alone at the time of his death, his wife still being a patient in that hospital. Mrs. McFatridge was taken there Nov. 5 suffering from bullet wounds in both legs, which she told police had occurred while a revolver, she was cleaning, was accidentally discharged. As a result of the unfortunate accident Mr. McFatridge was taken to the hospital the same day suffering from "nervous shock".

Mr. McFatridge was the eldest son of the late Mr. and Mrs. James W. McFatridge. a graduate of the Maritime College of Pharmacy, he had been a well known druggist of the North End of Halifax for a quarter of a century, carrying on the business of his father, a business that had been conducted by three generations of the family. Before entering business for himself, "Bob", as he was called by his many friends, began his drug career with J. S. Coombs, another Gottingen Street druggist.

He was an ardent salmon fisherman, fishing especially at the famous Margaree, where he was well known and liked by the sportsmen and guides.

He is survived by his wife, Enola Mae, also two sisters, (Marjorie), Mrs. C. G. Shields, Los Angeles, and (Maud), Mrs. A. C. Harris and two brothers, Geoffrey and Cyril of Halifax.

George B. Slaven Mayor of Sydney

ROLLING up what was believed to be the largest majority on record, Mayor George B. Slaven, druggist of Sydney, N.S., was swept back into office for another two-year term when he amassed a plurality of 1,675 votes over his opponent, ex-mayor S. E. Muggah, in Sydney's annual civic election.

Conceded Early

Slaven's election was conceded 40 minutes after the polls closed, as he rolled up substantial majorities in all but one of Sydney's six wards. Close of counting gave the mayor a total of 3,956 votes to Muggah's 2,281. Alderman-elect MacKenzie received 677 and Gallivan 540.

Practically 85 per cent. of the city's voting population turned out to exercise their franchise. Returns showed a total vote cast of 6,237 out of a grand total of 8,804. The figure was, however, a decline of 19 compared with the 1938 election when 6,256 cast ballots.

The druggist-mayor stepped into the post of chief executive of this city in 1938, when he defeated Muggah, his predecessor in office.

One of New Brunswick's best known druggists — Thomas Wran, of Campbellton,—passed away on November 20, following only a few days' illness. His death, which came as a shock to friends throughout the province, occurred at the Hotel Dieu Hospital in that town. He was 69 years of age.

A native of Wentner, England, he came to Canada as a boy. He had conducted a drug store business at Campbellton for over 40 years, during which period he took an active interest in all affairs pertaining to the betterment of his community. He was an ardent sportsman and although he had a preference for angling, he was a member of the Campbellton Curling Club and the Restigouche Golf and Country Club.
