has a picture of the team from Maccan.

Maccan is still in connection as a baseball town.

--there was a distinction between rich and poor in Maccan.

United Church and Baptists in Maccan. Catholic families go to Joggins and Amherst.

--Orange Hall in Maccan.

Orange Lodge was very popular.

--they'd put on picture shows in the Orange Hall.

--no unions in Maccan.

--now if you work at the Salt Plant you do belong to the union.

Lawson Mine. Canada Electric.

he worked in the Lawson mine. you'd crouch down in the mine.  
30" at R. Hebert.

--mine at R. Hebert 2000 feet.

--never any trouble in Maccan. a certain amount of drinking and fithing among themselves.

--would go into from Amherst truck--supplies for store.

--before that supplies for the stores would come in by train.

--dealt with Morrisons (grew into Atlantic Wholesalers)  
from Amherst.

used to stock carbide lamps.

they didn't get down so deep at Chignecto and Maccan.

lot of bootleg mines in this district.
