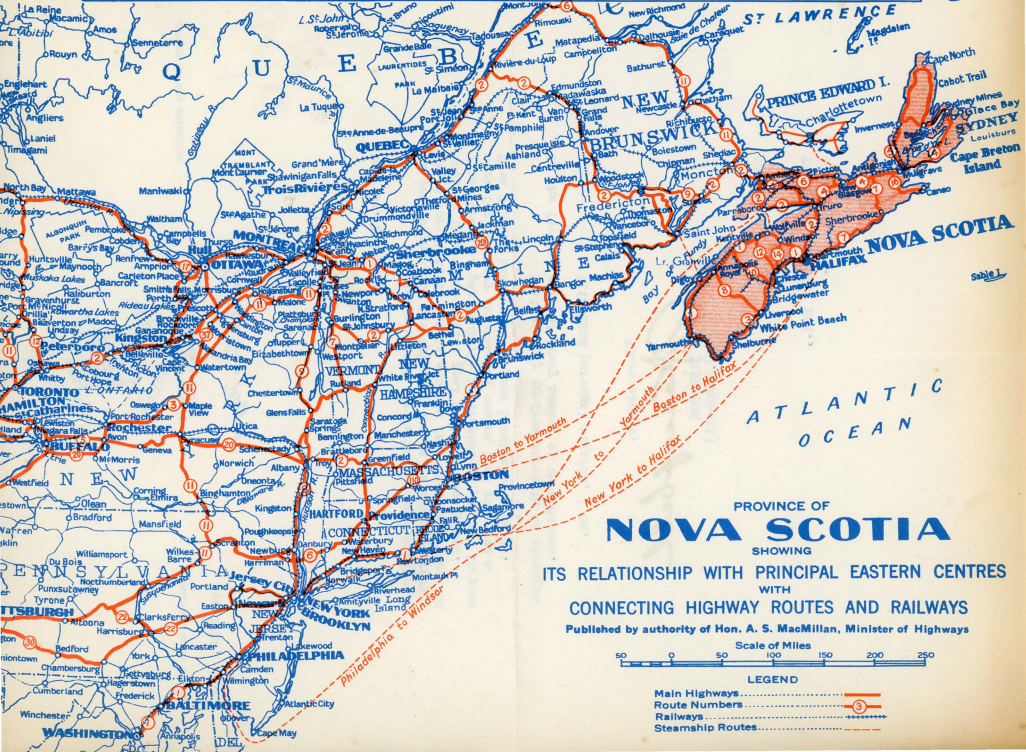

Dear Campbell,

When you asked me to write a sketch of White Point for your "Hospitality" bulletin I agreed, assuming that it was a simple business matter and that the sketch would appear without a by-line. Later, when you asked for my photograph, you stated that it would not be used in connection with the article.

I have just opened a copy of your bulletin and find that the sketch did appear under my name and that my photograph was very definitely connected with it. Thus I have been placed in the position of giving a personal endorsement to the White Point Beach Company, its management and all its works -- a position which I absolutely abjure.

Possibly this occurred by misunderstanding on your part or the part of your staff but it looks to me like a deliberate breach of faith. I forbid the further use of my name and photograph in this connection, either by your Department or by the White Point Beach Company.
