Dear George:

I've been pondering over your letter of June 22nd. One needs a certain gift of the gab to perform well on these public panels, and I haven't got it. I've never forgotten my first and last appearance on a panel at the Canadian Authors' convention at Toronto. The panel consisted of George Hardy, Ralph Allen, Mrs. Laura Salverson, and myself. The moderator was a young professor from some college or other, and he lost all control from the start. Mrs. Salverson, a pleasant but garrulous old girl, ran off with the subject right away. She'd been out of the public eye and away from the public ear for a long time, and like the lone wolf from Bitter Creek she figured it was her night to howl. George Hardy, who had had some experience in platform in-fighting, managed to shout his way into this monologue now and again when the lady stopped for a quick breath. Allen and I were left sitting like dummies. When it was all over I said "Never again", and so, I think, did Allen.

Even on a well conducted panel, such as the one proposed by the Universal Congress of Writers at Montreal in '67, I can't see myself offering profundities on "The Role of The Writer: Writing, An Art Form: The Writer, A Specialist: The Writer and His Media." I write from instinct largely, and what can you say about that? Years ago someone asked Walter Richard Sickert for some profundities about his art, and he snapped, "My pictures are like the clippings of my nails; they grow out of me and I cut them off, and that's all I know about it."

Needless to say it would be very pleasant to visit Sherwood Inn with you and Lily again. Ethel and I enjoyed that visit no end, and have talked about it many times.

How goes the sale of Hangman's Beach? I had a penciled slip from Lisa Drew at the New York office, enclosing some clipped reviews and saying "Sales as of 7/6 were 10,166". This I presume means U.S. sales. No mention of any book club interest.

Thank you for your letter of the 19th.

I am willing to do anything I can to advance the publicity of HA NGHAN'S BEACH, but in the case of the "Breakway" program on TV (Halifax station CJCH) I cannot see much point.

This program is a half-hour show beginning at 11 A.M. A young man and woman sit at a desk, chatting back and forth, and working in two ten minute interviews. My wife and I turned on our set the other morning to have a look at it. The two interviewed persons were a man talking about bulbs (tulips and so forth) and a young woman demonstrating a new sewing machine.

The show presumably is intended to afford a morning break for the busy housewife; but my wife pointed out the fact that busy housewives at that hour of the morning are turning to the preparation of the mid-day meal for youngsters coming home from school at twelve. The audience must consist largely of elderly people, invalids, and of course some women who have nothing to do at that hour in the morning.

I don't think it would sell a dozen books; and as the journey to Halifax from Liverpool involves a round trip of nearly 200 miles, much of it through traffic on a winding coastal road, it simply isn't worth the effort.

I do appreciate your thought, but I'm sure you will agree that there are better ways of advertising my book.
