



We recorded my part of the show yesterday. On Friday they record the actors, dovetailing it into the tape I made, wherein I set up each scene. She is taking great pains with this she and Bill Fulton, who did the adaptation, made a special boat trip off shore to record sea sounds, bell buoys, etc., so as to get it authentic. Elizabeth Fox, like myself, greatly admires your work.

Since the time I picked up a copy of "The Saturday Evening Post" (I believe it was) and fell under the spell of your story "The Wedding Gift", Reddell has been a favourite author in our house. I would be ashamed to tell you how often I have made use of your "Helifex: Warden of the North", as a source-book for ideas in my own work, which is largely doing radio talks. So well-worn has my original copy grown that, to protect it from firther soiling, it is now flanked by the new edition in paperback.

I do hope this production is a success and up to your expectations, and that perhaps you will allow CBC to use more of your stories.

Dear Mr. Raddall:

I was quite distressed to hear from Norman Creighton the other day that you have no knowledge of any contractual arrangements for a radio dramatization of your story "Before Snow Flies".

I made a request for clearance rights to our Copyright Department in Toronto on May 22 last. In due course I received a copy of the contract dated May 27, 1975, between McClelland & Stewart, 25 Hollinger Road, Toronto (as agent for you) and the CBC (represented by Duncan S. Sandison, Copyright Clearance Officer). The amount agreed on was \$200. The contract number is 7-3728.

So far as I am concerned, the receipt of the contract copy is my signal to go ahead with the dramatization - and I did, engaging Bill Fulton (writing under the name of 'William Edgar') to do the work. We taped the dramatization on September 19, and the program will be broadcast some time during the months of January, February or March, 1976, in the Audio Stage maritime regional series.

Bill Fulton did an excellent job of the dramatization, adhering very closely to your original story, and I am absolutely delighted with Norman Creighton's work as Narrator. I hope you'll be pleased with my production.

I do hope the matter of clearance rights will be sorted out satisfactorily. It seems to me that there was some hitch at the McClelland & Stewart end. Let me know if there is anything I can do at the CBC end.
