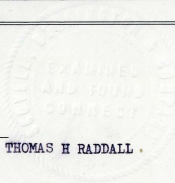

Dear George,

I have an enquiry from the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation about the use of "The Governor's Lady" as the basis of a short television serial, to be run in thirty-minute episodes. This would be shown on the Canadian network from coast to ~~east~~? They would like to have rights to use or sell their videotapes and kinescopes in Britain and the United States, if that is possible.

I have advised them that the negotiation of movie and TV rights in "The Governor's Lady" is in the hands of Doubleday, by contract, and I would request Doubleday to get in touch with them. Hence this letter. I have no idea what they are prepared to pay. As you probably know, the CBC is a government-financed non-profit business, quite unlike your NBC or CBS. Nevertheless we shouldn't sell these rights for peanuts.

It is agreed that residual rights for repeat performances over our network and for showings of our mechanical recordings in countries other than Canada will be available to us in principle subject to terms and conditions to be mutually agreed between us before provision for any other such showings is contracted.




Dear Tom:
