

To the Class of 1977:

"Greek and Roman writers were fond of representing life as a torch race-each succeeding generation handing on its light, its reason, its accumulated wisdom, to the next. The metaphor is especially applicable to the life of a university. Indeed the more one ponders an institution of learning the more conscious is one of the great responsibility which rests on it at all periods. It is not merely that learned men must preserve the treasures of the past, as was done by the Byzantines in a dark and troubled period: there is in addition to that a necessity that the spirit of learning, the thirst for new mental explorations, the desire to quicken and enlarge humanism, should be continually reinforced by the oncoming generation."

I have quoted from the Pharos of exactly forty years ago. President Carleton Stanley addressed these words to the 200 graduates, of whom I was one.

Dr. Stanley went on to ask: "Has the term 'university graduate' ceased to connote readers, explorers, humanists, hungers and thirsts for new knowledge?"

I would not wish to be President of Dalhousie to-day if I could not agree with him in his answer to this question: "There seems to me ... more and more serious endeavour to retain the best of our heritage and to apply it in an amplified way to our world. The outgoing classes, this year (1977 as well as 1937) in the various faculties, have given evidence of that spirit. I feel sure that they will continue to do so, and that because of them Dalhousie will be, even more than it has been, a home of living causes and unquenchable beliefs."



# George Kamsey Ninth Earl of Dalhousie

"Before I proceed in this ceremony, I think it necessary to state to you, gentlemen, the object and intention of this important work; I think it necessary to do this because I have never yet made any public declaration of the nature of the Institution I am here planting among you, and because I know that some part of the public imagine that it is intended to oppose the college already established at Windsor. This College of Halifax is founded for the instruction of youth in the higher Classics and in all Philosophical studies; it is formed in imitation of the University of Edinburgh; its doors will be open to all who profess the Christian religion; to the

youth of His Majesty's North American Colonies, to strangers residing here, to gentlemen of the military as well as the learned professions, to all, in short, who may be disposed to devote a small part of their time to study. It does not oppose the King's College at Windsor, because it is well known that college does not admit any students unless they subscribe to the tests required by the Established Church of England, and these tests exclude the great proportion of youth of this Province. It is therefore particularly intended for those who are excluded from Windsor; it is founded upon the principles of religious toleration secured to you by the laws, and upon



that paternal protection which the King of England extends to all his subjects. It is under His Majesty's most gracious approbation of this institution that I meet you here today, and as his humble representative. I lay this corner-stone of the building. I here perform an act which appears to me to promise incalculable advantages to this country; and if my name, as Governor of the Province, can be associated with your future well-being, it is upon the foundation of this college that I could desire to rest it. From this college every blessing may flow over your country; in a few months hence it may dispense those blessings to you whom I now address; may it continue to dispense them to the latest ages! Let no may it continue to dispense them to the latest ages! Let no

jealousy disturb its peace; no lukewarm indifference check its growth! Protect it in its first years, and it will abundantly repay your care!"

Dalhousie University was founded as the result of an idea of George Ramsey, ninth Earl of Dalhousie, Lieutenant-Governor of Nova Scotia in 1817, that a university be open to any student, regardless of class or creed. The funds used to begin construction of the university were obtained from customs duties acquired by the British during their period of occupation of Castine, Maine in 1814.

The original site of Dalhousie University was the Grand Parade, where Halifax City Hall now stands. On May 22, 1820, the Earl of Dalhousie laid the cornerstone of the first Dalhousie College.

The buildings were ready for occupation in 1823, but the professors had not been chosen, and even the early supporters of Dalhousie were becoming apprehensive, believing that King's College in Windsor was sufficient as an educational centre. As a result, the college was closed and served as a community centre from 1829 to 1838. There were two attempts to amalgamate with King's College, but both failed. Eventually, Dalhousie came to function as a college, in 1838.

with Reverend Thomas McCulloch as President until 1843.

There were only three possible chairs at Dalhousie when it opened, classical languages, mathematics and natural philosophy, logic and rhetoric. The first class consisted of twelve students, which later increased to sixteen. The courses lasted four years with the tuition being \$20, \$24 and \$6 respectively.

When President McCulloch died, the college again closed. It remained so until enough funds accumulated, which was in 1848. A Board of Governors was appointed by Joseph Howe, with Sir William Young as Chairman. During the period between 1840 and 1860, Dalhousie College became a high school named Dalhousie Collegiate School and later, Dalhousie High School.

In 1863, Dalhousie had a second President, Reverent James Ross. President Ross resigned in 1885 and he was succeeded by Dr. John Forrest, who, with his brother-in-law, Mr. George Munroe, founded five new chairs. They were Physics, History and Political Economy, English Literature



The Forrest building became Dalhousie's new campus at the turn of the century.




and International and Constitutional Law and Philosophy, Munroe donated \$350.00 which was used to erect new buildings and to improve the quality of the teaching staff. Mr. Munroe's generous grant was honoured with the proclamation of an annual University holiday in his name.

In 1882, due to a bequest of Alexander Mac-Leod, the chairs of Classics, Modern Languages and Chemistry were founded. Dalhousie moved to Carleton St. in 1886 where the Forrest Building was built housing the Faculties of Law, Medicine, Dentistry, Pharmacy and Biology. In 1912, for \$50,000, the Studley Estate was purchased and here the Science Building (now the Chemistry Building) and MacDonald Library were constructed.

Between 1920 and 1930, Sheriff Hall and the Law Building were completed. During the 1930's the Gymnasium and the Medical-Dental Library were built. The 1950's saw the construction of the Arts and Administration Building and the Memorial Rink. In the early 1960's, the Dunn Building was constructed, now housing Physics and Geology, and the Sir Charles Tupper Building, the new medical institute. The fall session of 1970 saw the completion of the beautiful Isaac Walton Killam Memorial Library where the faculties of Mathematics and Languages, and the Computer centre are located. The following year, the elegant Arts Centre opened, containing the Rebecca Cohn Auditorium. The vast Life Sciences followed in 1972, and it now incorporates the Biology, Oceanography and Psychology departments.

As Dalhousie celebrates her 158th anniversary, plans are in the making for further expansion of the educational facilities. The first sod was turned in the fall of 1976 for the Building of a new Dalhousie Sports Complex which is expected to be completed by 1978. The erection of a Physical Sciences Centre, and a Dentistry Building are also in the offing.



































# Men's Soccer











## Team Dropped from Sports Department

The University community was shocked on November 25th when Dr. Henry Hicks announced that Dalhousie was withdrawing from inter-collegiate football.

Football at Dal goes back to 1947, when the university became the first in the Atlantic region to field a team. At the time it was hoped that the game would grow in the high schools. Unfortunately, this was not the case, and now, in order to field a team, Dal must look outside the province, a practice strictly against the University's principles.

Athletic Director, Ken Bellemare, has expressed regret, but agrees that "It's hard to compete, when you don't have a chance." This is not the only reason, but the University feels that "if the product isn't the best" then "in these inflationary times ... we'd rather spend it (money) where it's of greatest benefit to more students."

Officials are quick to agree though, that while football is at present dropped, the door is not closed forever.















## November 9th National Union of Students Day

George Mitchell, Minister of Education, met with over 125 Dalhousie students on National Student Day, November 9th, to explain the position of the Provincial government on educational cutbacks. During a question period which followed a panel debate, the subject of new bursary policies were raised.

Beginning in September of 1976, students had to provide proof that they had passed 4 out of 5 courses, taken. If a student did not have enough credits, he/she was not eligible for a bursary.

The minister was part of a panel which included Dalhousie Student Union President, Gord Neal, Atlantic fieldworker for National Union of Students, Miguel Figeroa, President of the Dal Faculty Association, Dr. Puccetti, and Chairperson, University Vice-President, Andrew MacKay.

The forum was scheduled as part of National Student Day activities. Workshops and lectures were also held on campus in recognition of NSD.

National Student Day was created by a unanimous vote of delegates attending the 4th annual conference of the



## They Marched . . .


AFS, NUS and the student executives from all the provincial universities lent their combined forces to allow an organized march on Province House to take place protesting tuition hikes.

Approximately 1500 students marched peacefully on Friday. An amazing amount of solidarity was displayed by all campuses... but was the march effective?




