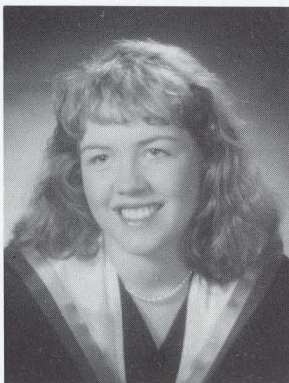

Basically Krista has been a great friend to many over the past 3 years; she's always willing to listen, help others and is especially willing to go out with the gang! Best of luck Krista!



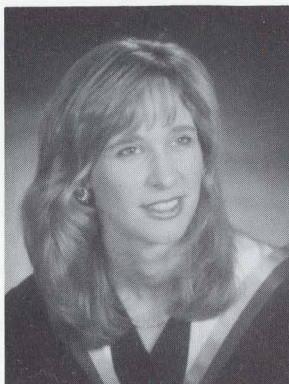

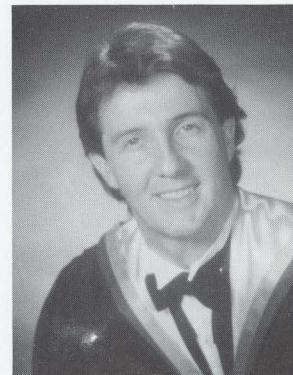
**Helen Marie Bilek, Antigonish, N.S.**

**Perry Davis, Newfoundland**

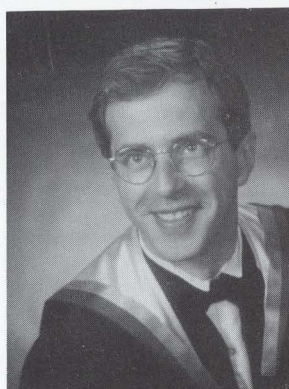

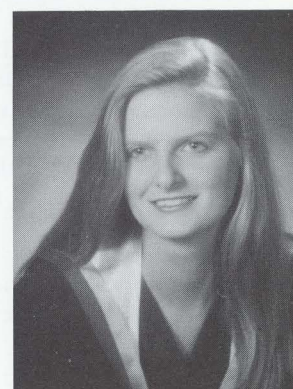

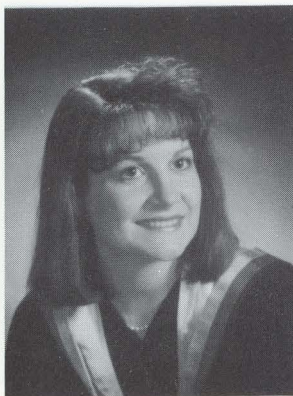
**Noreen Delorey, Antigonish, N.S.**

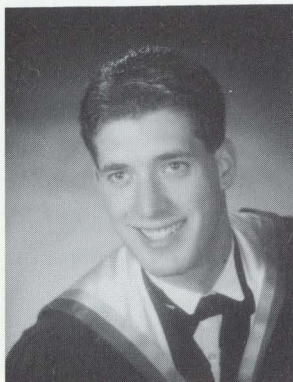
**Wendy DeMerchant, Plaster Rock, N.B.**

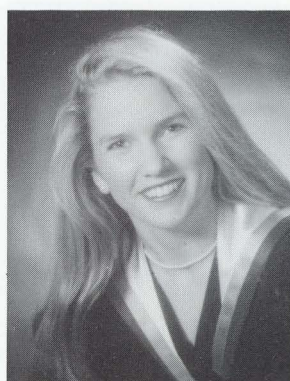
**Gina Ivany, St. John's, Newfoundland**

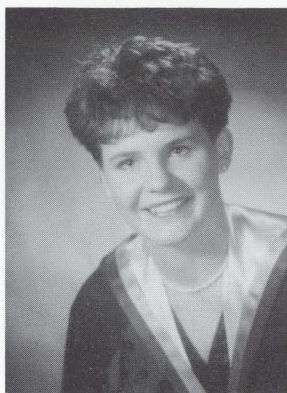
**Maureen Maillet, Halifax, N.S.**

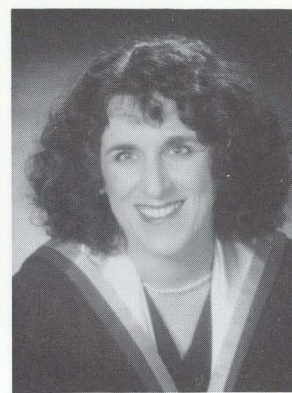
**Tracy Lund, P.E.I.**

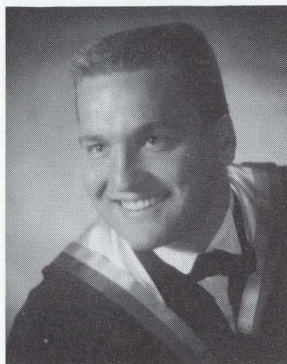
**Rachel Malenfont, Dorchester, N.B.**

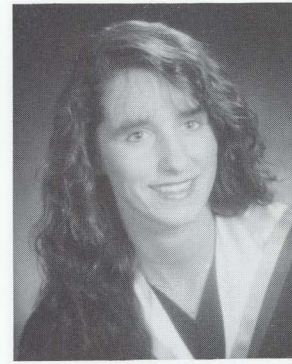
**David Allan MacDonald, Sydney, N.S.**

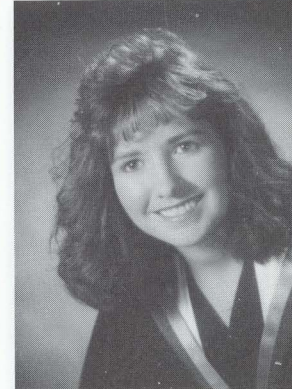

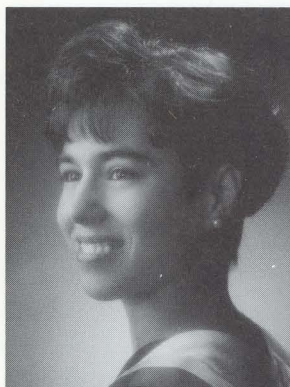
**Melanie Madden, Yarmouth, N.S.**

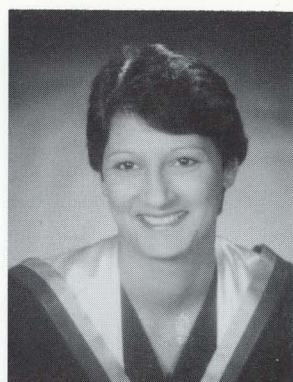
**Jo-Ann Scott, Halifax, NS**
