RELITIONSHIPS ... THE "ART OF ARTS".

There has always been a variety of human loving down through the centuries and these different sorts of loving make different demands and create different expectations. These varieties of human loving, whether it be the love of God, the love of community or the love of another person involve the passions. These passions must in some way be disciplined and directed to good purposes if love is not to be pure illusion, for indeed, the toward love and relationship can often become the source of the sharpest conflicts and the bitterest divisions both within ourselves and with others if this fact is not recognised.*movement

The ancient writers called love the "Art of Arts". One of the things meant by this phrase was that any relationship worthy of the name involved the participants in an exacting personal discipline of making choices and establishing commitments. As this is true in the development of an artistic talent so it is true in establishing relationships.

The human heart is the same for gay and straight people. We all have the same needs and the same tendency for destruction. If our lives are to unfold in a fulfilling way we will have to cultivate a searching self-knowledge, aware of our limitations and our strengths. Only then will it be possible for us to give ourselves to another.

The beginning of any relationship starts with the desire and the belief that it is possible to fulfill yourself in a total commitment to another person. This involves certain demands and creates particular expectations that must eventually be shared by the two people. This initial commitment, founded only on the desire to build relationship, makes progress in the relationship possible as we seek to know the other person and to share our lives with them. It is, however, important to recognise that a real relationship is only possible between those whose lives, habits and interests are alike and whose intentions are genuinely for their mutual good. It is therefore not possible to have for a friend someone who has no respect for him/herself and it would be disastrous to commit oneself to such a person. All relation--ships must begin with a mutual self-respect. It is the one strength that must be there from the very beginning if the relationship is to become a joy and not a burden.
