I hold all the rights in ROGER SUDDEN, and I am sure we can come to a satisfactory agreement about its use in a TV series.

I presume you know that CBC made a TV serial from this book in 1952, when they had no national network, just a few stations in Ontario and Montreal.

I believe it was their first attempt at a TV serial.

Patrick Moliee played Hoger Sudden, and was so taken with the whole thing that he wrote me afterwards suggesting a full scale motion picture production. However, nothing came of that, and Hollee went on to greater glories in "The Avengers".

The 1952 agreement was made with CBC by my (then) Canadian publishers McClelland & Stewart, of Toronto. TV was so new that they assumed this was the same as an agreement with an individual radio station, and they sold a one-shot right to CBC for the sum of \$1502

This and other experiences taught me to gather into my own hands the movie and TV rights in all my novels.
