Independent World Commission on the Oceans

Chairman Dr. Mario Soares Former President of the Republic of Portugal

In recognition of the fundamental importance of the world's oceans in the development of the human society, the maintenance of peace, and the health of the biosphere, an Independent Commission on the Oceans has been established.

The Commission takes its place in a long series of Independent Commissions, from Willy Brandt's Commission on North-South Relations and Olof Plame's Commission on Disarmament, to Gro Harlem Brundtland's Commission on Environment and Development and Ingvar Carlsson's Commission on Global Governance. They all have stood for the dignity and equality of the individual, for equity and greater freedom and the right to economic development a healthy environment, and security for present and future generations.

The Independent World Commission on the Oceans, the most recent in the series, will continue this great tradition. It faces its own challenge: the oceans are a "blind spot" in global awareness. Our land-trained minds are not aware of the unique role the oceans play in planetary survival nor of their potential for satisfying an increasing part of our basic needs. This is why we tend to turn our backs on the oceans and to ignore the threats they are facing.

Y et the oceans are forcing us to think differently, to behave differently. Neither fish nor pollution recognize the boundaries we try to impose on them. Political space, economic space, and ecological space refuse to coincide, and as the world shrinks under the impact of the communication and information revolution, the oceans are no longer seen as spaces to cross or to conquer, but as spaces to be cultivated. They belong to all of us and are entrusted to our safekeeping for future generations. They are a heritage of mankind.
