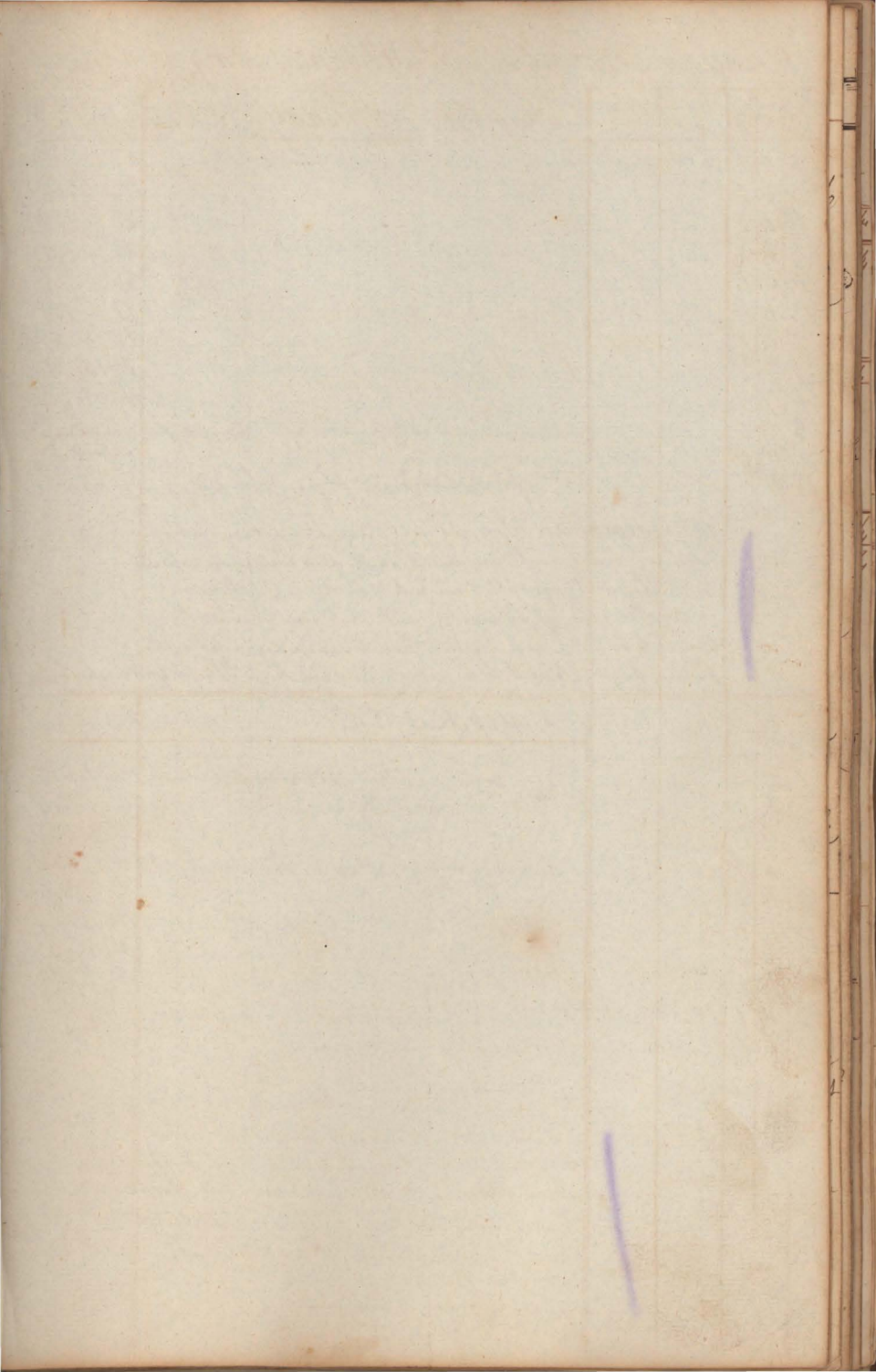

I went on shore about my business, and when I came on board again found he had felt himself quite well and gone on shore to take a walk, in the evening he had not returned and at about 9 P^m some of the men came on board and I was informed in the morning Mr Devou was sick on Shore, I immediately went on shore to see him and found him with some slight fever, he said had been walking about considerable and then thought he woud ^{go} up to Miss Clarkes the woman that wash'd for us and see about his clothes, that he got there he found himself so unwell that he had to stop, that Miss ^{Clark} appeared to be a very good doctress, had given him Medicine and that he then felt very well and should come on board before night - I offer'd to get a Doctor but he refus'd saying that he was much better attend'd to than a Doctor would do for him

Narrative of Mr. Devous Sickness and Death

I visited him again next morning found him seemingly well, but Miss Clark told me he had had some fever in the night with heat in his head, that she had difficulty to get medicines to operate on him but had succeeded to her wishes. he told me he should come down board after breakfast - but I advised him to tarry where he had a comfortable cool place and good attendance, he continued there from Wednesday till Sunday when he came on board, said he was tolerable well - I had no kind of doubt but he would soon get stronger as we should soon leave the sea air he refused my getting a Doctor though I got advice and every medicine that was needfull - he slept remarkable well that night - and next morning we got out to Sea, for some days he seemed to be getting better but generally had some fever at night and he complained of not getting rest enough although I thought he slept too much, we used a warm bath for him at night and salt water in the morning, he for some days was able to stay up awhile and read, when there fell strong gales and rough weather which fatigued him I found his spirits fail him and the fever increase so that I began to be much alarmed, he had all possible attendance paid, although the mate and most of my crew were sick, he would tell me he was very well or better and to the others would say he would never get home again - and before we arrived at Long Island we had to lift him about like an infant, after much exertion and fatigue we anchored in Great Harbour Long Island on the 1st of July 1819 at noon I immediately hired the dwelling house of the late Mr. W. Donato having two rooms and in a healthy cool situation and got all the sick on shore at 3 o'clock P.M. - - - - -
