
## Kelley Bacich Halifax, NS


## Jillian Bergman


## Keltie Cameron


## Jennifer Cantwell


## Jay Cooling




## Léon DesRoches




## Paul Easton


## Bryan Enman


## Reta Holland North Lake, PE


## Natalie Hurlburt


## Camille Izzard


## Gillian Leblanc




### Fredericton NB


## Katie Melvin




## Michelle McCarthy


## Kate McMillan


## Jennifer Merlin




## Jennifer Penney


## Meaghan Peters

## Janet Roberts



## Eva Silver






## Kristin Steeves


## Rob Wilcott


**Kathy Wiscombe**
