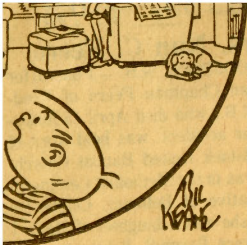

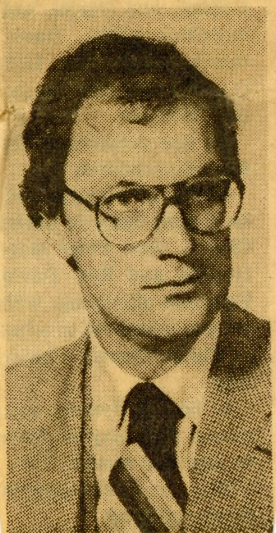

Noted pharmacist Jessie MacKnight dies in Halifax

Jessie Irene MacKnight, of Halifax, died Sunday.

Born in Pictou, she was a daughter of the late Andrew J. and Margaret (Dunbar) MacKnight.

She was educated in Pictou schools. After graduating from Pictou Academy, she taught school in several parts of Pictou County, including Stelarton.

Later, she graduated from Maritime College of Pharmacy in Halifax. Licensed to practise pharmacy by Nova Scotia Pharmaceutical Society, she practised first as a hospital pharmacist at the Victoria General Hospital. Later, she joined the staff of Maritime College of Pharmacy as director of dispensing practice, and still later as assistant to the dean of college.

Upon retirement in 1961, after 40 years of service, she was honored by Dalhousie University with an honorary doctorate of laws, honoris causa.

Other professional honors she received included honorary membership in Nova Scotia Pharmaceutical Society, the Canadian Pharmaceutical Association, the Nova Scotia Branch of Canadian Society of Hospital Pharmacists, the Student Pharmacy Society and the Canadian Society of Pharmaceutical Faculties.

In 1973, Dr. MacKnight was pre-

sented with the A.H. Robins' Bowl of Hygeia Award for outstanding community service in pharmacy. In 1973 she received the Nova Scotia Pharmaceutical Society's fifty year certificate of recognition.

Active also in non-professional activities, Dr. MacKnight was a charter member of Halifax Club of Business and Professional Women, in which she held several offices including that of president. Having been instrumental in compiling a 40-year history of that club in 1976, she was honored by presentation of its honorary life membership certificate.

She was the last surviving member of her immediate family.

She is survived by several nieces and nephews in Nova Scotia, elsewhere in Canada and the United States. She is also survived by cousins in California and Colorado.

She was predeceased by three brothers and an infant sister.

The body is in Snow's Funeral Home, Halifax, where funeral service will be 11 a.m. Wednesday. Burial will be 2:30 p.m. in Haliburton Cemetery, Pictou.

N. S. Man Gets Important Post

NEW GLASGOW, Nov. 12—D. E. MacKenzie, assistant professor of pharmacy at the Ontario College of Pharmacy and a son of Mr. and Mrs. E. S. Part of the work is being financed directly through the British Government and part through Lease-Lend arrangements.

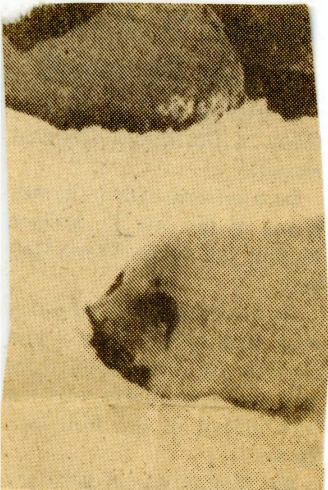

CAN EUROPE BE D

PARIS (UP)—Europe can be defended.

That claim admittedly is controversial and much debated in military circles in this age of nuclear weapons.

It represents the best judgment, however, of many military leaders consulted during a 6,500-mile tour of North Atlantic Treaty Organization defenses in Europe and the Mediterranean area.

Top officers at allied headquarters here point to evidence that Russia well respects NATO's ability and intention to defend itself.

Despite political and economic stresses and troubles ranging from Greek-Turkish disputes over Cyprus to the French army deployment into Africa, NATO has seen 100% successful militarily. It has prevented war and it has protected its territory for eight years.

If the deterrent should fail and Russia should be foolish enough to start a war, NATO strategy does not envision any prolonged land campaigns fought over European terrain, so far as can be told from non-secret information.

Whatever the destruction, strategists believe they can prevent the continent from being overrun and enslaved.

The aim would be for ground and air elements comprising NATO's forward shield to hold at or near the Iron Curtain until retaliatory air forces could deal crushing blows to the Soviet

Union. That would not take long, according to available estimates.

Vice Admiral Charles R. Brown, U. S. 6th Fleet commander in the Mediterranean, estimated to visiting reporters that the U. S. Strategic Air Command could rain down the bulk of its punishment in something like 16 hours. The fleet, too, would get in some blows in that time, he indicated.

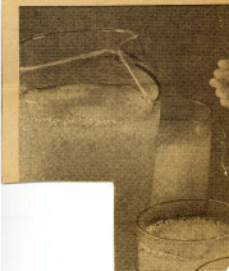

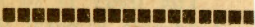

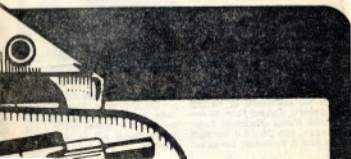

law of Mr. Fuller, was long an active partner.

The deceased was in his 86th year, and was born in Wendover, Buckinghamshire, England, on March 6th, 1851. He was a son of Charles H. and Charlotte S. (Hosier) Fuller. The family came to Nova Scotia in 1865, locating at Halifax, where Robert F. learned the drug business, under the late M. F. Kegan. In 1874 he came to Amherst to enter the employ of Dr. Nathan Tupper, seven years later bought the business and reestablished it under the name of R. C. Fuller and Company, a name which it carries at the present time. This was the first drug store in the county of Cumberland and by his enterprise and good judgment it succeeded to embrace a wide clientele. In 1882 Mr. Fuller took into partnership Mr. John W. Morrison, who in recent years has been the managing director of the firm.

Mr. Fuller was always active in community affairs and was a member of the first Town Council in Amherst after incorporation. He was the last surviving member of that first administrative body in the town. He always maintained a keen interest in civic affairs, but his activities covered a wide range. He was chairman of the Amherst Cemetery Company for many years and was also prominent in the affairs of the Amherst Curling Club. He was president of that club on different occasions and was one of its representatives at many outside gatherings. In

his playing days he was one of the best curlers in Amherst, and occupied his interest up to his 80th year. He was a man of fine appearance, tall and erect, and was always distinguished in his manner.

Mr. Fuller was also a true identify with Christ Church and served as many of its important committees for many years. In fact in every department of church and community life Mr. Fuller was a genuine citizen, doing his part to help build up the better and blader Amherst which was the pride of our citizens in that boom period. He was one of the active committee that organized the movement to plant trees on Victoria Square in honor of her golden jubilee in 1887. He was also one of the active members of the old Times Week committees in 1916.

His wife, who survives him, was Sophia B. Tupper, a daughter of Dr. Nathan and Ellen (Hewitt) Tupper of Amherst, to whom he was married on Sept. 8, 1877. To this union three children were born, only one of whom survives, Mrs. Warren M. Steele, teacher at Ixworthville Hall, Toronto, but who has been spending her holidays at home during the summer. There is also one grandchild, Mrs. Ernest H. Pope, nee Sophie Steele, in Toronto. She was here visiting her grandparents a short time ago. There will be the deepest sympathy of a large circle of friends with the members of the family in their great bereavement.

The funeral will be held from Christ Church on Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock with Rev. W. A. Fuller in charge of the service.

Daniel Hockin, 69, Dies At Vancouver

VANCOUVER, April 29.—(CP)—Daniel Hockin, 69, president of British Columbia Drugs Limited and a director of National Drug and Chemical Company of Canada, Limited, died here last night. He had been in ill health for some time.

Mr. Hockin entered the retail drug business in Truro, N. S. in 1868, and subsequently became assistant manager to the Halifax branch of the National Drug Company in 1906. He came to Vancouver three years later.

He was in charge of the British Columbia division of National Drug Company until 1938 when B. C. Drugs was formed. He leaves three sons, D. Milne, John F., and Neil W., and one daughter, Mrs. Neville Cumming, wife of Wing Commander Cumming serving with the Royal Air Force.

Mr. Hockin was a native of Nova Scotia. After entering the drug business at Truro he moved to Amherst and later to Halifax where he graduated as a druggist in 1892. He was associated with the wholesale drug firm of Simson Brothers before that company was merged with the National Drug and Chemical Company in 1906.

sion I make somebody else only
if you give me a concession that
I regard as an equivalent."

In practice, this resulted in
vitiating most-favored-nation
treatment because there was al-
ways room for dispute as to
whether a concession was actu-
ally the equivalent of that grant-
ed by a third country.

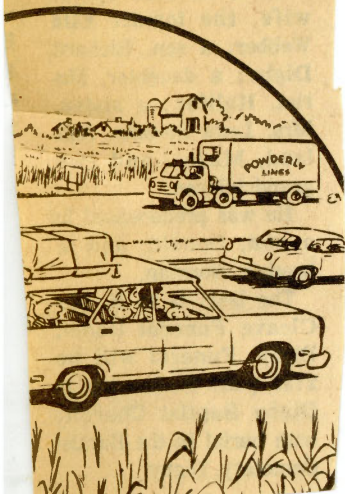

MIAMI (AP) — The head of the FBI's Miami office says it was possible that information sent by the FBI to Bahamian officials influenced their decision not to renew fugitive financier Robert Vesco's residence permit.

Vesco, wanted in the U.S. on charges arising from the Watergate scandal and from a million-dollar stock scandal, has been ordered to leave the Bahamas by Dec. 11.

Special agent Arthur Nehrass said Tuesday he wasn't sure why the Bahamian government ordered Vesco out, but added: "Possibly part of

the reason is we have been able to disseminate to Bahamian officials some information concerning criminal activity."

Some of the information linked Vesco to a suspected drug smuggling operation in the Bahamas, Nehrass said.

Vesco has denied involvement with drug smuggling.

Nehrass said the reports sent to the Bahamas also discussed suspicions that Vesco attempted to corrupt officials of both the Nixon and Carter administrations.

Former Dartmouth mayor Claude Morris dead at 91

In his earlier years, he was tenor soloist in several church choirs and participated in many amateur

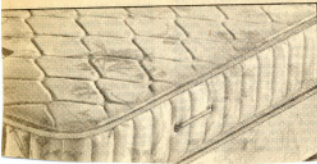

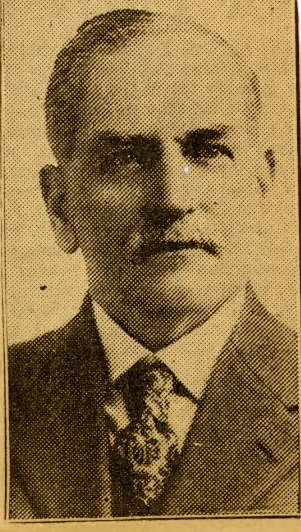

W. Ormond, 86, Dies In Amherst



W. L. ORMOND

AMHERST, March 19 — W. L. Ormond, one of the veteran druggists of Nova Scotia, died at his home here today in his 87th year. A native of Sydney, Mr. Ormond graduated from the old Halifax Medical College. Later he went to Thorburn, then known as the Vale Colliery, and opened his own drug store. He moved to Amherst in 1899, purchasing the Tremaine drug store.

He is survived by his wife, who was formerly Miss Mary Isabel Grant of Antigonish, five sons, Lawrence, K. C., of Calgary; Frank, Douglas and William in Amherst; Ernest in New Glasgow, and two daughters, Mrs. D. H. MacAulay and Miss Eileen, both of Amherst. He also leaves a sister, Mrs. Anthony Gannon of Sydney. A son Cyril died in 1920.

Mr. Ormond retired from active work a few years ago and his son, William has been conducting the Amherst business. His son, Ernest, is in the drug business in New Glasgow.

ASSISTED IN OPERATION

Dr. J. G. MacDougall of Halifax, was at one time clerk in Mr. Ormond's store at the Vale. Mr. Ormond assisted Dr. George Stewart, a native of Malagash, in the first major operation held in Thorburn.

An honorary president of the Canadian Pharmaceutical Association, Mr. Ormond was a past president of the Nova Scotia body and historian of the same group. He wrote a book on the history of pharmacy in this province and many of his articles and essays are contained among the records of the provincial association. He took a leading part in having a statue erected for Louis Hebert, first druggist who practiced in Nova Scotia at Annapolis in 1605.

WORKED FOR PARK

He was an active member of the Amherst Board of Trade and was directly responsible for having the site at Fort Beausejour declared a national park. He was perhaps the leading authority in these parts on the early history of the Isthmus of Chignecto, a hobby that he had enjoyed for many years. He was president of the Canadian Patriotic fund in Amherst during the First Great War and took a leading part in the formation of the Great War Veterans Association in Amherst. A strong Conservative, he presided over the final banquet held here in 1915 in honor of Sir Charles Tupper, Bart.

The funeral will be held at ten o'clock on Monday morning from St. Charles. Mr. Ormond a devoted Catholic, attained the fourth degree in the Knights of Columbus and was a member of the Halifax Council K. of C. He was also a life member of the Canadian Red Cross.

Prominent Citizen ¹⁹⁴⁰ Of Pictou Passes

R. Dickson Stiles Played Leading Part In The Community

PICTOU, May 17.—The death occurred at his residence on Prince Street this morning following a month's illness of R. Dickson Stiles, widely known druggist and optician, and for many years prominent in the life of the town of Pictou. He remained active until a few months ago, when his health began to fail. Mr. Stiles was in his eightieth year. He was born just outside the town, a son of the late Daniel and Margaret Hogg Stiles.

Mr. Stiles began his business life with the late J. D. B. Fraser, famous Pictou druggist and chemist of the past century, and after learning the drug business under him, spent some time as a drug clerk in Halifax and River John. He later studied as an optometrist and optician, and practiced his profession, as well as being connected with the drug business in Pictou for many years. About 25 years ago he took over the widely known drug business of J. D. B. Fraser and Son, and conducted it until failing health forced him to close it a few months ago. He continued, however, with his optometrical practice until his last illness.

WAS FIRE CHIEF

Chief of the Pictou fire department for a total of 22 years, Mr. Stiles joined the department in 1889, serving as captain of the ladders and later as assistant chief. In 1906 he succeeded the late P. O. Carroll as chief and served several years. In 1928 at the request of the citizens he returned as chief and reorganized the department, and remained until his retirement a few years ago. He was long active in the Pictou agricultural society, and at one time served as president for six years, and as such was chairman of the Pictou exhibition committee.

An ardent sportsman, noted for his love of angling and hunting, he was president of the West Pictou Rod and Gun Club since its founding 17 years ago. Mr. Stiles took a keen interest in fraternal work. He was a member of Eastern Star Lodge No. 1, I.O.O.F., and of New Caledonia Lodge No. 11, A. F. and A. M. In his younger years he was a cricketer and at one time was a member of the New Caledonian Curling Club.

Mr. Stiles was a member of First Presbyterian Church, and for a number of years was a member of the board of management of the church.

Besides his wife, who was formerly Katherine Jane Munro, a

daughter of the late Captain and Mrs. William Munro of Pictou. Mr. Stiles is survived by one son, Raymond, electrical engineer of Montreal. Mr. and Mrs. Stiles celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary on September 23, 1938.

The funeral will be held from First Presbyterian Church at 2:30 p. m., Sunday, with Rev. D. A. Campbell officiating, and it will be under the auspices of Eastern Star Lodge, I.O.O.F. Interment will be made in Haliburton cemetery.

To Remain On Standard Time

CHARLOTTETOWN, May 17.—A group of business houses in this city, numbering twenty-five, announced tonight they would continue to operate their establishments on Standard Time. They said they were opposed to the move to establish Daylight Time because "when not adopted by the entire province it works to the disadvantage of the public in general and particularly to the rural districts."

The City Council decided this week to introduce Daylight Time here, beginning on May 23 and continuing until September 2.

ily as his reputation for service and courtesy spread, and he later opened his present Agricola street store. It was not until some years later that he opened his Almon street store.

IN CIVIC POLITICS

In addition to building up a successful drug business he took an active interest in civic politics. Back in 1907, with the late A. B. Crosby, he ran on the water meter ticket for Ward Five, vigorously denouncing the family compact. Both aldermen were elected, and Mr. Thompson remained in the City Council until the expiration of his term in 1910. At that time he retired from politics to devote his time to his growing business, but in 1931 he returned to the civic arena as alderman for Ward Five again, succeeding Alderman A. Drysdale.

The following year, 1932, saw him enter the mayoralty contest, when he defeated Mayor George E. Ritchie, and ex-Alderman J. W. McCarthy.

During his two years as mayor he took a great interest in relief matters, and on several occasions came out in favor of the provincial and civic governments coming to the aid of local welfare associations, which, he said, were expected to carry on too much of the relief work in the city.

He served as mayor from 1932 to 1934, two terms, and during his tenure took the first steps towards the installation of the present police radio system, which was inaugurated in the fall of 1934. While mayor he was elected chairman of the County Court House Commission for 1933.

ACTIVE MEMBER

He was an active member of the Nova Scotia Pharmaceutical Society having served as secretary of the board of examiners, and in 1939 he was elected honorary president of the society.

He was a member of the Presbyterian church, and of the Royal Sussex Lodge, and at the time of his death, was president of the Charitable Irish Society, and of the Sheldrake Rod and Gun Club.

He was taken ill two weeks before Christmas, when he was removed to hospital. He left the hospital shortly after New Year's and seemed improved for a week or two, but was re-admitted to the hospital on Tuesday.

Mr. Thompson had no immediate relatives and never married. His funeral will take place on Saturday afternoon at three o'clock from Cruikshank's Funeral Home, 416 Robie street, with Rev. R. C. Chalmers officiating. Burial will be in St. John's cemetery.

Halifax Druggist, Ex-Mayor, Dies

Prominent Halifax Man Dies In Hospital; Ill Short Time

A. Audley Thompson, prominent Halifax druggist and former mayor of Halifax, died at the Victoria General Hospital early yesterday afternoon following a short illness. He was 61 years old.

Mr. Thompson was one of the leading citizens in both the civic and business life of the city, and had a host of friends.

He was born in Springhill, where he spent most of his early boyhood, coming to Halifax with his parents when he was about 12. He received most of his education here, taking up the study of the drug business in his late 'teens. He served his apprenticeship in Halifax, and opened his own store when he was under 21. This store was located at the corner of West and Agricola streets near his present Agricola street store. His business increased stead-

Reports Sub Sighted Near Grand Banks

NEW YORK, Jan. 30 (AP)—The freighter Sheaf Crown reported tonight that she had sighted a suspicious submarine" approximately 60 miles east of St. John's, Newfoundland.

The call heard here shortly before 10 p. m., A. S. T., said she was at latitude 47.52 north, longitude 50.24 west.

The 4,568-ton Sheaf Crown last reported leaving Baltimore Dec. 1 for Land's End, England.

FIRST INDICATION

The freighter's call was the first indication that submarines might be operating in this area at the northern end of the Grand Banks.

St. John's is the site of one of the naval bases leased by the United States from Britain.

Maritime circles expressed the belief that it would be possible for large ocean-going submarines to operate in that vicinity.

During the First Great War, the German submarine Deutschland made two 20-day trips to the United States and returned to Germany with commercial cargoes.

Before the United States entered the war in 1917 the fighting Submarine U-53 also stopped in an east coast port. On her outward voyage she sank six Allied and neutral merchant ships a few miles at sea before the war ended. German submarines picked off 91 ships in American coastal waters.

There have been numerous reports of Nazi submarine activity during the last year in the Caribbean and off the coast of South America.

day when they are scheduled to leave for Ottawa. They came to Halifax from a visit to Saint John.

Mr. Smith described the board's arrival as a routine visit but he said full consideration would be given to problems which, in large measure, the war had created. One of these was the matter of providing a fireboat for Halifax Harbor, which he said would be discussed with "the organizations concerned."

The modern and extensive berthage facilities at Halifax had amply proved their importance to the whole nation, Mr. Smith said. "Without the great Atlantic ports of Halifax and Saint John I don't think the war effort, so far as Canada's participation is concerned, would be fully completed," he continued.

"The activity in these Atlantic ports and the traffic and cargoes going through now is just a small beginning for what is going to happen in a year's time—that is, if the war continues that long. The importance of these two ports will be the upgrade so long as the war goes on."

The Harbors Board chairman, however, was silent on the subject of Halifax Harbor in the post-war years. That was a subject he could not discuss, he declared.

Mr. Smith said he had heard no suggestion that Sydney be placed within the Board's jurisdiction. At present the Board's ports are eight—Halifax, Saint John, Chicoutimi, Quebec, Three Rivers, Montreal,
