

the signatory nations will grant to each other most-favored-na-tion treatment on a wide range of commercial dealings and subiects.

That means that each agrees not to give any better treatment to any other nation than it gives

to the other signatory.

Most of the United States old commercial treaties are defective not only because of their age, but also because they embrace the principle known as conditional most-favored-nation treatment. This means, i. effect: "I'll give you the same concession I make somebody else only if you give me a concession that I regard as an equivalent."

In practice, this resulted in vitiating most - favored - nation treatment because there was always room for dispute as to whether a concession was actually the equivalent of that grant-

ed by a third country.



He wrote a book on the history of pharmacy in this province and many of his articles and essays are contained among the records of the provincial association. He took a leading part in having a statue erected for Louis Hebert, first druggist who practiced in Nova Scotia at Annapolis in 1605.

He was an active member of the Amherst Board of Trade and was directly responsible for having the site at Fort Beausejour declared a national park. He was perhaps the leading authority in these parts on the early history of the Isthmus of Chignecto, a hobby that he had enjoyed for many years. He was president of the Canadian Patriotic fund in Amherst during the First Great War and took a leading part in the formation of the Great War Veterans Association in Amherst. A strong Conservative, he presided over the final banquet held here in 1915 in honor of Sir Charles Tupper, Bart.

At that time he retired from politics to devote his time to his growing business, but in 1931 he returned to the civic arena as alderman for Ward Five again, succeeding Alderman A. Drysdale.

The following year, 1932, saw him enter the mayoralty contest, when he defeated Mayor George E. Ritchie, and ex-Alderman J. W. McCarthy.
