The Social Year in Review!

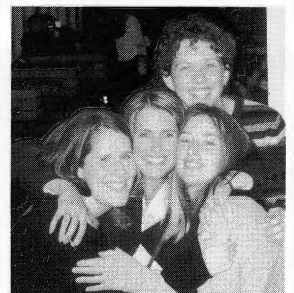
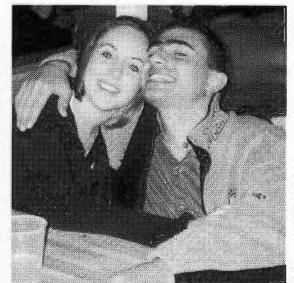
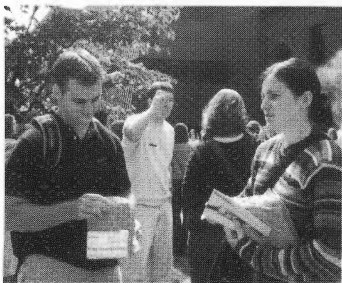

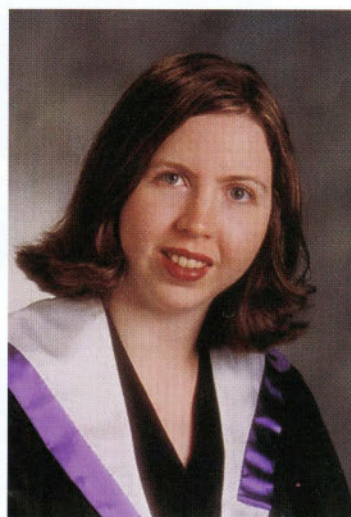
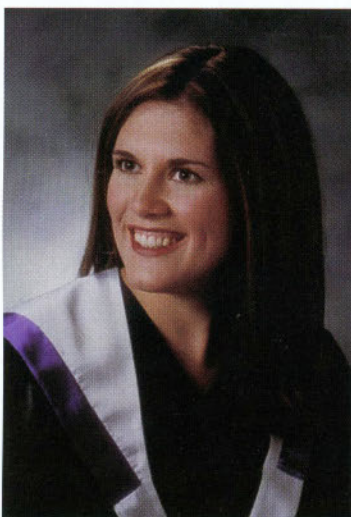
Laura Achenbach

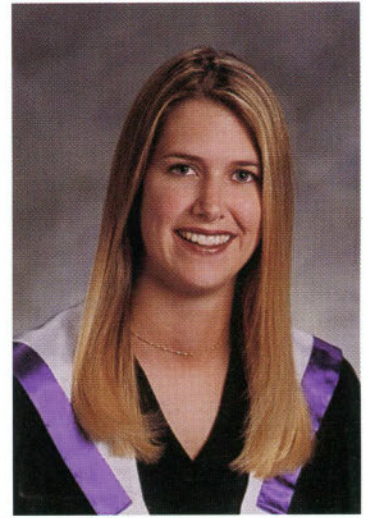


Kim Carruthers

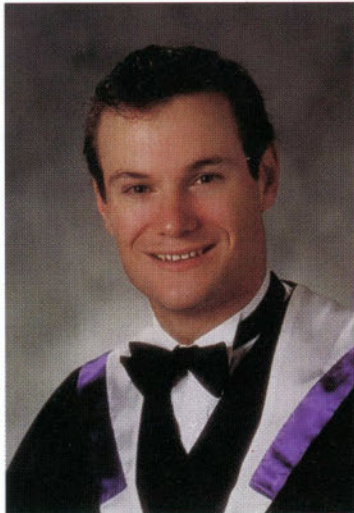
Jill Cotton

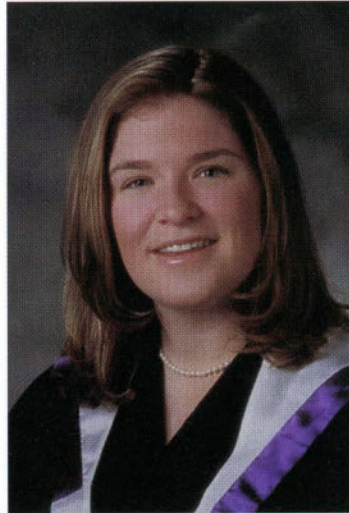
Ray Cushing

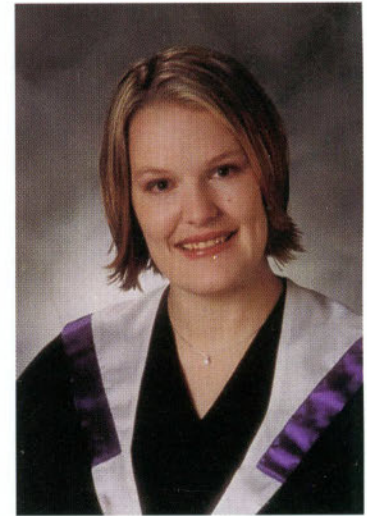


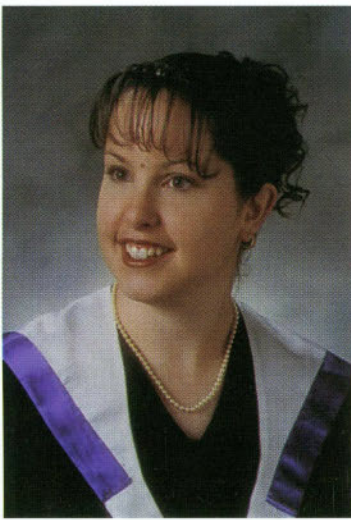
Beverly Dawson

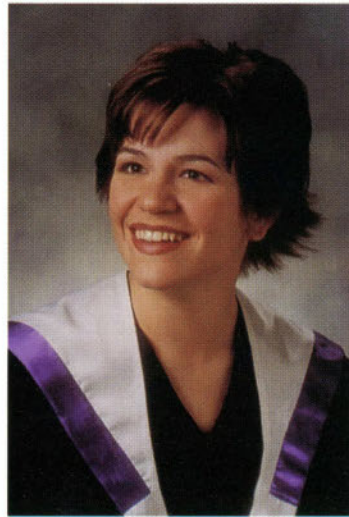
Sylvie Macias

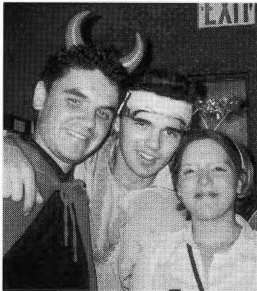


HALLOWEEN 2002
