In the six years since its inception, the Black and Gold Club has played an integral role in the athletic programs at Dalhousie. The involvement has included a large financial commitment as well as behind the scenes help.

Financially, the club has raised in excess of 95000 in membership revenue from alumni, parents, and friends of Dalhousie. These funds have provided our students with many services. A sample only of these services are:

200 plus students recieve a weekly post practice meal for four months.

Over 1500 hours of tutorial assistance has been provided to 57 students.

23 bursaries have been awarded.

72 student athletes have been presented out Most Valuable Player Award in 13 varsity sports.

152 Varsity Awards have been given to student athletes who have completed three years of intercollegiate competition.

5 outstanding Nova Scotians have been presented with the Dalhousie Award.

This is an attempt to convey the step from one form of existence into another and <u>Lovesongs - Old Records -</u> <u>Side One</u> with choreography by William Forsythe and Music by Aretha Franklin and Dionne Warwick.

The programme for Sunday, February 12 includes <u>Brouillards</u> with Choreography John Cranko and music by Claude Debussy, <u>vision-flection</u> choreography by John Alleyne (who recently performed here with the National Ballet), <u>Pavane with</u> choreography by Reid Anderson, <u>Urlicht</u>, choreography by William Forsythe and <u>Lovesongs - Old Records - Side One</u>.







Dr. Jeremy W. Hayward: "Shifting Worlds, Changing Minds: Where the Sciences and Buddhism Meet"

The similarities of western science and oriental philosophy have intrigued, instructed , confused and perplexed students of both fields at least since the 19th century.
