Anatomy Lect. 20 —

Respiration - (recovery of persons ~~not~~
Waxed and Crowned. When the Instruments
recommended are not at hand, fill a com-
mon bellows and blow into the trachea
stopping the nose, then press on the Abdo-
men upwards to empty the Lungs, repeat
the operation with the bellows. As the blood
becomes black and stagnant in the right ^{side} ventricle
of the heart blood should now be let. Cordials
should not be given, untill there be some
signs of recovery; for at first the patient
having no power to shut the Esophageal
the Liquid may pass into the Lungs instead
of the Stomach.

In the foetus there is but a partial cir-
culation from the right to the left side of the
heart by the right to the foramen ovale. This open-
ing shuts soon after birth and the blood circulates
thro' the Lungs which it did not do before.
