

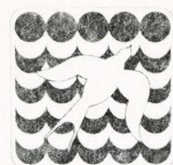

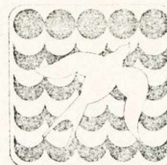

Dear Mr. Vollmer:

Our Canadian member, Mr. Maxwell Bruce of Toronto, who is also associated with the Bermuda Biological Station, suggested I get in touch with you and give you some information on our International Ocean Institute in Malta. It is our hope that the Vollmer Foundation might support one or the other of our activities.

The International Ocean Institute was established in 1972 with the cooperation of the Government of Malta and the United Nations Development Programme. It is an independent institution at the University of Malta, governed by an International Board of Trustees and a Planning Council. Our Trustees include Mr. Jan Pronk, Minister of Development Cooperation of the Government of the Netherlands; Dr. Anton Vratusa, Deputy Prime Minister of the Government of Yugoslavia, Mr. Maurice Strong, former Director-General of UNEP. Our Planning Council, of which I have the honor of being Chairman, includes Ambassador Galindo Pohl of El Salvador, Ambassador Castaneda of Mexico, and Ambassador Yankov of Bulgaria -- to name only a few names which are certainly familiar to you. A complete list of the members of our governing bodies is attached.

The purpose of the Institute is to study in depth the issues underlying the building of a new international order in the oceans, to propose new approaches and solutions, and to widen the circle of the dialogue on ocean affairs. Besides the annual Pacem in Maribus Convocations -- five of which have taken place in Malta, a sixth one in Okinawa, and the seventh is planned for October 22-25, 1976, in Algeria -- the Institute has organized a series of regional meetings in cooperation with the Governments of Yugoslavia, of Jamaica, and of Mexico. It has sponsored a series of research projects on such subjects as the Development of the Mediterranean, the Development of the

Caribbean, the feasibility of an Ocean Development Tax, Energy and the Oceans, Disarmament and Arms Control in the Oceans. It has organized seminars at the University of Malta, and published a series of books and proceedings. It has official observer status at the Third United Nations Conference on the Law of the Sea whose work it has been following closely and analysing meticulously.

Our next major project is an Ocean Yearbook. This is described in the enclosed project outline. The Yearbook will be published by McGraw Hill in New York. We expect a world-wide distribution of 15,000 copies. The World Bank has encouraged us to apply for a grant of \$100,000 for the three year period, and we have also applied for ten-thousand dollar grants to the Bank of Sweden, and the Government of Canada. We have also applied to three Foundations (Ford, Rockefeller and Doherty, in the United States.

We would very much welcome collaboration and cooperation and help from Venezuela. Do you think your Foundation might contribute to this project?

Our basic facilities in Malta are provided by the University. But all our projects and meetings have to be financed by special grants. We have, in the past, obtained grants from the Ford Foundation, the General Service Foundation, the Bank of Sweden, the Agnelli Foundation, ENI, the Volkswagen Foundation, the Commonwealth Foundation, among others, as well as from private individuals. Contributions in the United States can be made to the Friends of the International Ocean Institute, a public Foundation incorporated under California law, with an IRS ruling making contributions tax-exempt.

I would be very grateful for a chance to discuss this matter personally with you, or your New York representative. Our activities are, undoubtedly, educational. Also, we are in close touch here with the Delegation of the Holy See to the U.N. Conference on the Law of the Sea. Msgr. Cheli, I am sure, would be glad to give you further information.

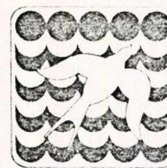

Dear Mr. Vadrot:

Thank you for your letter of January 19, which arrived this morning. Of course I am familiar with Le Canard Enchaîné, but I have not seen Politique-Hebdo.

You are right: we have done a lot of work, at the International Ocean Institute and Pacem in Maribus, with regard to Mediterranean problems. First, there was a volume by Lord Ritchie Calder on the pollution of the Mediterranean, which is still quite useful and very readable; then we published a big volume on Mediterranean development and cooperation; and, just last month, we provided the expertise for a seminar organized by the University of Malta and the Mediterranean Student Council, which will result in another volume.

I am asking our office in Malta to send you all this material.

As to my personal opinion with regard to the Mediterranean, I am not very optimistic without being apocalyptically pessimistic. I think the environmental problem is serious in certain regions, and due to the peculiar hydrology of the Mediterranean, these regions do have some effects on the entire basin. However, I think the news of the death of the Mediterranean is premature. On the other hand, the environmental problem cannot be dealt with in isolation. It is an integral part of a much wider, economic and political problem. What is required is a network of effective management systems in the Mediterranean, for nonliving resources (oil), for living resources, for scientific cooperation, for environmental policy, and an "integrative machinery" to cope with the interaction of all uses of marine space and resources in the Mediterranean. The suilding of such a system, which can be quite decentralized and very flexible, could be initiated even in the present atmosphere of tension and conflict.


