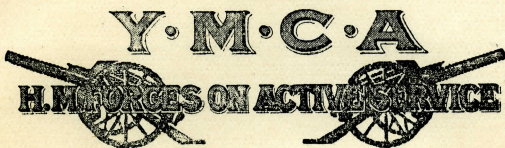

Guess you have almost lost hope of hearing from me Lulu.

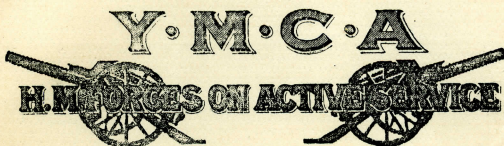
We, Sid Ormon & I, left camp yesterday morning & came right up to London. He went off to some relatives of his for the night & I went to Mrs Moores.

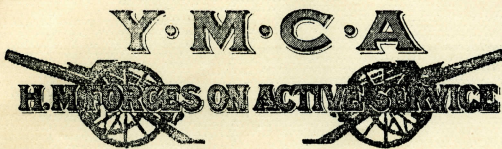

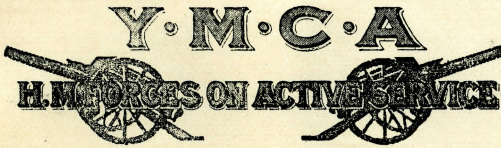
Am enclosing some cards of the city. Hope you got the ones of Scotland alright.
