Dear Sir:

The Subcommittee on Energy of the House Committee on Science and Astronautics has the responsibility of investigating and reporting on research and development requirements associated with future national energy needs.

One high priority Subcommittee subject is the publication of an annual inventory of ongoing energy research in this country. A copy of last year's inventory may be obtained from the Government Printing Office.* We are now in the process of gathering data for the next publication. The purpose of this letter is to solicit your cooperation and that of others within your organization in this activity.

As in previous years, this work is being carried out by the Information Center Complex at Oak Ridge National Laboratory with support from the National Science Foundation and by the Atomic Energy Commission.

The Inventory will cover all research and development related to energy. Only energy-related R&D with an annual expenditure of at least \$5,000 is to be included. We are interested in research currently under way or concluded after December 31, 1972. A more detailed description of its scope is given in the attached instructions.

The energy survey questionnaire is also enclosed which, when completed will provide us with the needed information. This should be filled out as completely as possible and returned to the Oak Ridge National Laboratory. Instead of completing the questionnaire form, you may wish to submit copies of your standard documentation, if it includes the desired information. A separate questionnaire should be used for each energy R&D activity. If additional copies of the questionnaire are needed, you may either duplicate the one enclosed or request more from Dr. Caton at the address listed on the questionnaire.

It is not necessary to reveal any specific proprietary descriptive information. Informative general descriptions of the different areas of your research will be adequate.

The expenditure information is especially important because summary tables are prepared of the amount spent in various research areas. Any proprietary expenditure information will be used only in the preparation of these summary tables; amounts cannot be broken out and associated with a specific company, organization, or project.

We would like to have this detailed information as soon as possible and in any event no later than January 15, 1975, sooner if possible. Please send it in the enclosed, self-addressed envelope.

I would like to express my personal thanks and appreciation for any assistance that you can give us in this project.
