**Dark End of the Street** -- Monday evenings from 9:00-10:30 Lamont McLaughlin presents a range of blues and jazz, mixed with spoken word, ranging through Dave Brubeck, Jeri Brown, Oscar Peterson and Glenn Miller.

**Winning the Space Race** -- Wednesday mornings from 9:30-10:30 Lucas Pearse explores a diverse selection of music, including Charles Mingus, Bob Wiseman and Merzbow.

**On the Jazz Tip** -- Thursday evenings from 9:00-10:30 Rod Caballero focuses on the groovy end of the jazz spectrum, featuring such artists as Dr. Octagon, Wes Montgomery and One Step Beyond.
