This death notice appeared in The Casket, April 10th, 1862: "Died at Shelburne on the 24th alt, in the 34th year of his age, Rev. W. C. McKinnon, Wesleyan Minister, and son of Lieutenant John McKinnon of Leitches Creek, N. Sydney."

Mr. McKinnon was for some time editor of a paper published at Sydney, C. B., and was the author of some novels. One was entitled "SL George or the Canadian League", and was "dedicated to Sir Edward Lytton Sullier, by his humble and ardent admirer — The Author." It was published in Halfara in 1852 by Ediridge Gerry Fuller and it dealt with the Canadian Rebellion. Another work by this writer was entitled "SL Castine, a Legend of Case Breton."
