

Thank you so much for all your help.

As agreed, I am enclosing copy of my letter to the Director of Fisheries. Anything that you can do to arouse his interest in my work, and the importance of this trip for this work, will be greatly appreciated. You remember the beautiful pictures I got during my last trip to China, which are in the other book, the Drama of the Oceans. This time I would hope to get many, many more.

I fully realize that these matters take time, but last time, thanks to the intervention of a friend, I received my visa so quickly that I could hardly believe it.

It would be my hope to spend the last ten days of April and perhaps the first days of May in the Peoples Republic, and of course I could pick up my visa anywhere -- for instance, in Tokyo from where I could leave for Peking.

Please note that I should be accompanied by a young photographer, Mr. Robert Ketchum. It would facilitate my work greatly. I hope that this is not too much of an imposition on the Chinese Authorities. Mr. Ketchum is an independent photographer. He does not work for any American organization. However, he is absolutely first-rate and, although very young, has already had a number of personal exhibitions.

He has applied to the Liaison Officer in Washington.

I hope to see you in Peking!


