We still retain our position of having the highest membership in CAPSI and both of us have been very involved at the national level in keeping with Dalhousie's tradition.

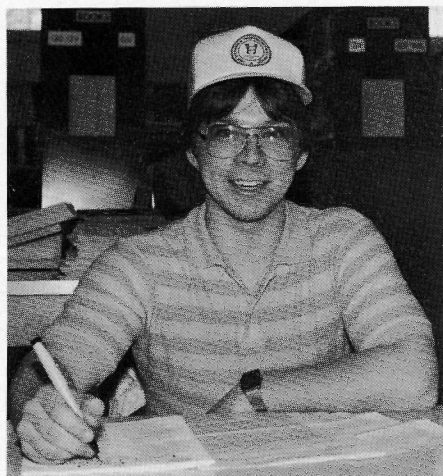
Five of our students attended Professional Development Weekend (PDW) in Toronto this year. We were successful in bringing it to Dal. for 1983 so we are really excited about that!

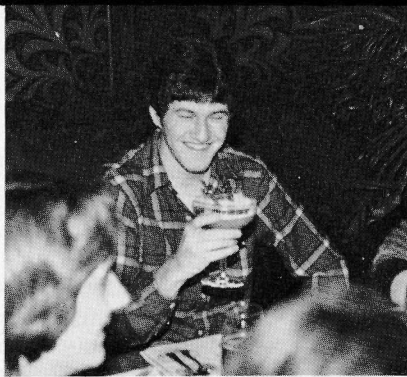

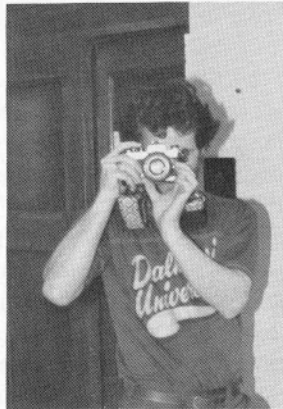
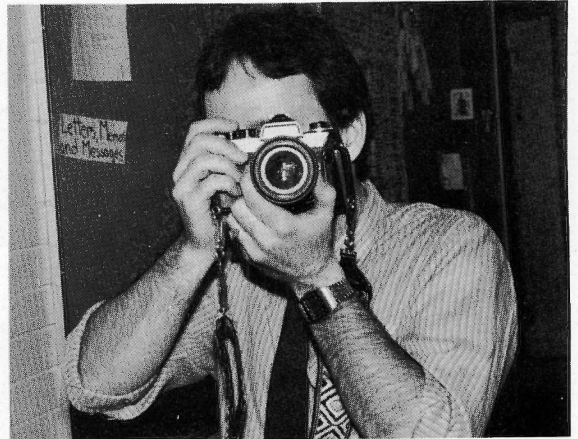

PUBLIC RELATIONS

This year the public relations committee became involved in a project aimed at grade four children. The objective was to encourage the development of a proper respect for drugs and their usage and, thereby, prevent drug abuse later in life. A teacher's resource manual was created, containing an introductory skit, with the central character being Astro Andy and a theme of "Use Drugs Wisely - How Wise Are You?" The individuals involved in this aspect of P.R. worked diligently for a long time - editing and re-editing. Their efforts were rewarded when glowing reviews were received from grade four teachers who edited the manual. It still requires some finishing touches; however, our endeavors, this year, will (someday?) play a significant role in elementary curriculum health education.

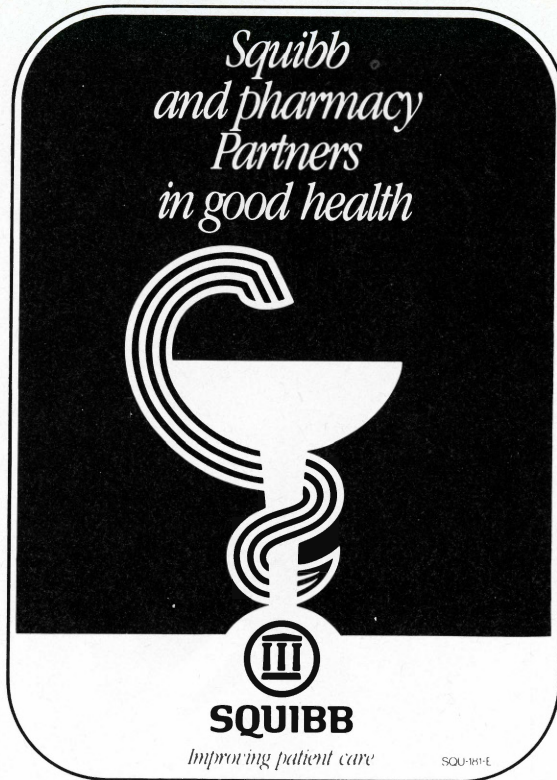
Another area of P.R. involved the media. Radio spot announcements were developed and newspaper articles were written to reinforce the role of the pharmacist on public health care. In addition, a fact sheet on Ipecac Syrup and common household poisonings was included in a package, with the radio announcements and newspaper articles, and distributed to all retail pharmacies in New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and P.E.I.

Under the direction of Gary Guitard, all drugstores in the Maritime provinces received information on the Manitoba "Drug Caution Code." Students worked to create an evaluation questionnaire on this system and all stores employing the "Drug Caution Code" evaluated its success within their store.

I would like to sincerely thank each individual who became involved in this year's P.R. project. The work became tedious and frustrating at times but success was imminent because all participating students worked hard to achieve the established goals. I also owe my sincere thanks to "model" pharmacy P.R. promoters - in particular, Dr. Yung and professors at the College of Pharmacy - who supported and encouraged our efforts this year.
