Given the circumstances that the Director-General is in the process of restructuring the Secretariat, this is the right psychological moment to approach him on these matters.

Dear Director-General,

We are very grateful to you and to your colleagues, notably Professor Kaddoura, Assistant Director-General for the Sciences Sector, for the great encouragement you gave us in the pursuit of our common objectives concerning the marine and ocean environment.

Through our letter of 17th May 1984, we have filed an application for the Institute's adhesion to Category C status in Unesco and we hope that it will eventually receive favourable consideration.

In the light of the cordial discussions we have had with you and Professor Kaddoura, it seems to us that Unesco could assist the Institute in the following areas :

I. Training

(i) In addition to the support already given by I.O.C., there could perhaps be an annual provision of a number of fellowships to enable candidates from Third World countries to attend our training courses (Class A on Ocean Mining; Class B on Economic Zone Management and Class C, Regional Programmes on integrated Ocean Management, involving both natural and social science aspects). We hardly need to emphasize to you, Mr. Director-General, the importance of having a suitably-trained cadre of officials

and experts, in the developing world, acquainted with marine issues at this crucial stage of transition to a new ocean regime.

(ii) We would also seek, if we may, the technical and, to the extent possible, financial assistance of Unesco through I.O.C., the Division of Marine Sciences and the Division of Socio-Cultural Environment in the development of the curricula of our courses as well as the provision of lecturers for them.

(iii) Since training is the main goal of the Institute, we wonder whether, in this context, we could take the liberty to submit for your consideration the following proposal :
The Institute itself, though directed through Dalhousie University in Halifax, Canada, is in fact institutionally registered in Malta where it has its administrative office and is associated with the University of Malta. The first Director was Dr. Sidney Holt, formerly of F.A.O. and sent to Malta, in agreement with its Government, under UNDP auspices to assist in the launching of the Institute.

With the great increase in the Institute's work, particularly in the wake of the UN Convention on the Law of the Sea, there is a great need to have a resident training Director who is fully conversant with problems of the environment, especially in Third World countries. We would request you to consider the possibility of having a Unesco staff member of sufficiently senior status (to enable him to negotiate efficiently with Governments and with International Agencies) seconded by Unesco to the Institute for periods of 3/4 months per year to run the Institute's training programme (especially the Category C courses). It is felt that such an appointment would strengthen the ties between Unesco and I.O.I., while giving a real contribution to the Institute which would thus not have to cover the Training Director's emoluments.

II. Publications

Published by the Institute, the Ocean Year Book (used as a textbook for our training programmes), the only existing publication on all major issues concerning the oceans, could benefit from an annual contribution from your Organization, which could take the form of the purchase, by Unesco, of a number of copies to be distributed freely to depository libraries in the marine sciences and other appropriate institutions in the Third World.

III. Other Areas of Possible Cooperation and Assistance :

In its series of case-studies designed to provide a conceptual and operational framework integrating the marine sector into the development process, the Institute cooperates with Unesco and its IOC. It is felt that this collaboration could be considerably expanded if marine resources and ocean management are to have their rightful place in development strategy in the 80s and beyond. Apart from the above-mentioned training programmes, the Institute organizes annual Pacem in Maribus convocations at which legal experts, diplomats, marine scientists and industrialists discuss current issues on all aspects of ocean development and

world order. We would therefore like to explore possibilities of obtaining assistance for these endeavours from Unesco through Funds-in-Trust and other appropriate sources e.g. Arab Funding Sources.

In this connection, the Institute would be pleased to organize in cooperation with Unesco a series of regional meetings, possibly at ministerial or senior governmental level, to acquaint them with current developments in ocean affairs and the implications of the new ocean regime for the research, use and management of their resources and related institutional arrangements required for that purpose. Such a first meeting could be based, with appropriate adjustments, on the one envisaged in paragraph 10517 in 22 C/5 Approved. The I.O.I. would be pleased, if required by you, to carry out the study therein mentioned as well as to organize, under contract with Unesco, the Category VII Seminar in 1985 (perhaps in an African country).

While looking forward to closer cooperation with Unesco in the pursuit of its noble tasks under your inspired and inspiring leadership, we are needless to say, entirely at your disposal, for further discussion on these matters.

In connection with the suggestion that Professor Elizabeth Mann Borgese and I have made to you in our formal letter enclosed herewith concerning the possible secondment of a senior member of the Unesco Secretariat to IOI to act as its Training Director (particularly for Category C courses) for 3/4 months per year, I wonder whether I may venture to suggest that the type of person who would ideally fit our requirements is Dr. Salvino Busuttil, Director of the Division of Human Settlements and Socio-Cultural Environment. Apart from the circumstance that he is an Emeritus Professor of the University of Malta, with which IOI is associated, he has been actively involved in the Institute's work from its foundation. He has also worked closely with Dr Mario Ruivo, Secretary of the International Oceanographic Commission.

He is known to most members of the IOI Board as a dynamic person, keenly responsive to Third World Problems. (He was, inter alia, UN Adviser to the Prime Minister of The Bahamas before coming to Unesco). Since the work of the Training Director would involve negotiations with the Malta Government (with which he has served in senior capacities) as well as with other Governments and Agencies, I feel he would be an appropriate person for this assignment.

Needless to say, I make this proposal purely on a personal basis, without in any way wishing to influence your decision in this matter.

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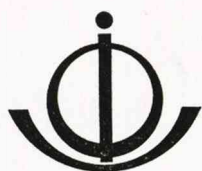
