Dear Michael:


We just finished working on Arvid Pardo's book

I really appreciated the opportunity to meet and talk with you at the Traveses. Since returning to the Bay Area I have been extremely busy working on various projects, but I did manage to discuss our conversation regarding OCEANS with the publisher, June Degnan and with Don Kelley, the editor. Apparently the IOI report was dropped from OCEANS sometime last year at the suggestion of Arthur Inman, the former publisher. Both the publisher and the editor expressed their interest in including information on IOI in future issues of OCEANS although the exact format of such reports will have to be worked out.
