

Inasmuch as by a mutual agreement W<sup>ch</sup> whose names are subscribed &
 p<sup>at</sup>ented or Adventured and of the Com<sup>ro</sup>ll of New England are to reign in the
 said order to his Majesty of the great Charter of that Country which was granted
 into us in the eighteenth year of the Reign of King James the first in our
 in whose presence & he were drawn for settling of divers and sundry divisions of
 lands on the Sea Coast of the said Country upon most of us, who hitherto have been
 bene confirmed in the said lands so called. And to the intent that every one
 of us according to a quiet and in reasonable manner convenient to his Adventure
 or other interest may enjoy a proportion of the said lands of the said Country, to be
 immediately possessed of his Majesty W<sup>ch</sup> herefore doth hereby give and grant
 all that part of the said Country aforesaid shall belong to the right hon<sup>ble</sup> Edward
 Lord George. To begin at the middle of the West entrance of the Naragansett and to
 proceed along the Coast Eastwards to Cape Codd and round about the same bearing on
 North Eastwards to Namsack which is on the East side of the Bay of the Massachusetts
 and from thence North East into the land One hundred and twenty myles distant from
 the West mouth or entrance of the Naragansett containing by the Nonesuch Cape
 of the same to the head thereof, and from thence into the land North West wards till
 One hundred and twenty myles be finished from the first Entrance from which period
 to reach our land to the hundred and twenty myles and accounted West from Namsack
 as aforesaid together with some thousand acres on the East part of Sagadahock. Saving
 and reserving out of this division to every one that hath any lawfull grant of lands
 or plantations lawfully settled in the said Country his holding and enjoyment of
 his right with the liberties thereof as pertaining unto him his heirs and assigns
 (if he have any) to the proprietors of this division whom his lands by us and paymes
 some small acknowledgement for that he is now to hold his said lands and one of
 the proprietors of this division.
