- 28. gown of light brown lustrous, Auburn curls done up without powder, jaunty white chip hat.
- 63. dressed in pale pink satin, trimmed with crepe & spangled with silver (playing Juliet at the theatre)
- 136. (at a masquerade) a pink jacket & coat, with loose gauze thrown over it.
- 137. The dressed belle of Hyde Park, trimmed, powdered, patched, painted to the utmost power of rouge & white lead.
- 138. a brown Capuchin cloak & hood.
- 188. Perdita at a masquerade, in a becoming military attire, scarlet faced with green.
- 188. Asahel through Hyde Park in a new phaeton drawn by four chestnut-colored ponies, with a postilion and servant in blue & silver liveries. The lady... dressed in a blue great coat trimmed with silver, a plume of feathers grass her hat.
- 191. Calling on Queen Antonelle in Paris: a dress with pale green lustrous train & body, festooned with delicate lilacs, & a Tiffany petticoat... a chapeau of white feathers.
- 193. At the Paris opera: in white satin with purple breast bows, a cap of white & purple feathers (1782) entwined with flowers, & fastened on with diamond pins.
- 195. (1782) a beautiful rainbow green of the slightest shade, with carnellite bows & trimming... Her hair ornamented with braided wheat ears fastened with diamond pins. (at the London opera)

195 (1782) At a masquerade at the Pantheon: a dress of white crepe, with festoons of white flowers, & a cap trimmed in a similar manner.

204 (1782) A French style called chemise de la Reine . . . gold-licked stockings.

204. A magnificent new carriage.

298 1790 (twelader) set a new style by wearing their sashes hung loosely across the shoulder like ribbons of Knights of the Garter. In August the Prince of Wales adopted the French fashion of wearing trousers instead of knee breeches in the morning.

302. 1790 William Millerforce, Long member from Yorkshire, had been spokesman since 1787 for the Abolitionists led by Thomas Clarkson. Larkton opposed Abolition. P. 316

344 1794. Mary's carriage & horses cost £200 a year.

345 1794. Whites, Brooks's, Almack's clubs, & gambling at Faro, macao, hazard & roulette. P. 354

347. 1794. The Theatre Royal, Drury Lane.

349 1794 Some of the Whigs had stopped powdering their hair, some even cropped their hair in emulation of the French.
