 bunch of Boys we will be leaving  
 here about the middle of April arrive  
 in England first of May spend one  
 month in Brighton and then for 10  
 days I want you to keep waiting  
 until the middle of May any way  
 as there might be some thing there

 be having eight days leave and  
 then will break the month up pretty  
 Well support you will have Jay  
 cards long before you get this letter  
 some laughing you will do at Logh
