- 2. A report on the status of the "Training Program."
- 3. A tentative agenda for Pacem in Maribus IX in Yaounde, January 1979.

Report on Meeting with Maxwell Bruce, John Hayward, and Janvan Ettinger, at the RIO Foundation, Bouw Centrum, Rotterdam, on June 9, 1978.

In accordance with the decision of the meeting of the Planning Council of April 22, 1978, the Chairman, in consultation with Jan van Ettinger, prepared a budget that would assure continuity, stability, and efficiency to the IOI and its operations at a minimum level. The budget is attached. The budget, sources of funding, and distribution of fund-raising activities, were discussed at the meeting of June 9. A fourth, related, subject was the preparation of a publicity leaflet.

### A. Budget

- 1. The budget covers two years: the academic years 1978/79 and 1979/80, including Pacem in Maribus X.
- 2. The over-all expenditures (operations in Malta & projects) for both years are the same. It is assumed, however, that during the second year, a slightly larger share of the income from "projects" will be devolved to "operations in Malta," thus enabling us to take on a second professional and an additional typist.
- 3. The operations in Malta are estimated as U.S.\$ 100,000 for the first year, \$ 125,000 for the second. Funds for projects amount to \$ 275,000 for each year; of these, \$ 25,000 go to Malta the first year, \$ 35,000, the second.

#### B. Sources of Funds

#### 1. Malta operations

The University of Malta has been providing about \$15,000  $\underline{\text{in}} \ \underline{\text{kind}}$  (housing, utilities, telephone, postage, and secretary). The balance is to be assured through the Friends of the IOI, projects, and royalties, as follows:

#### 2. Projects

Of the funds for projects, at present (a) about \$25,000 are assured for each of the two years under consideration (Vol.s II and III of the Yearbook). These come from (i) the General Service Foundation; (ii) the Government of the Netherlands; and (iii) royalties from the University of Chicago Press.

(b) The project on Marine Resources, Ocean Management, and Development Strategy for the 80s and Beyond has been initiated on a grant of \$25,000 from IFDA; a matching grant is hoped for from FUNDPAP (U.N. Trust Fund. (c) The "training project" is being initiated on an interim budget for six months, for \$60,000. These should be forthcoming from SIDA, the Saudi-Sudanese Red Sea Commission, and the Government of Algeria.

### C. Distribution of fund raising activities

- 1. The fund raising activities should be divided into two parts:
  - -- Project funding
  - -- Contributions.
- 2. The project funding should be the responsibility of the Director of the IOI. He should have enough travel funds at his disposal for this purpose. He should be assisted by introductions and recommendations by members of the Board of Trustees and the Planning Council. During the first year he will be very actively assisted by the Chairman of the Planning Council, since negotiations with a number of potential grantors are already in course. These grantors will largely be Governments and Foundations.
- 3. The "contributions" funding will be undertaken by Mr. Hayward. It will include contributions from Banks, industrial firms, and individuals and should amount to \$60,000 during the first year, \$65,000 during the second. Mr. Hayward indicated several possibilities during our meeting. He thought, the balance of the Yearbook budget coul easily be assured through two major, very ecologically oriented

Banks in Chicago, with whom he has close contacts. He also thought he could raise the 25,000 needed for Pacem in Maribus (travel funds).

### D. Publicity Folder

For fund raising and public relations purposes in general, it is essential that a new, simple folder be produced, outlining the purpose, history and programme of the IOI. The folder, which will cost about \$1,000.=, will be put together with the advice of Mr. Hayward. It will be printed in Malta and distributed from there.

### Status of Training Project

- 1. As I reported at the last Council meeting, SIDA has expressed serious interest in the training project, and, in principle, its readiness to support it. I think that arrangements with SIDA, for a grant of \$20,000 towards the interim budget of \$60,000, will be concluded in the imminent future.
- 2. In the meantime, Dr. Erich Blissenbach of Preussag A.G. has been successful in interesting the Saudi-Sudanese Red Sea Commission. Correspondence is attached.
- 3. I also had a highly encouraging and helpful talk with Dr. Layachi Yaker. Algeria would be the third sponsor of this initial phase. Here, too, conclusion of the arrangements sis imminent.
- 4. We are now making plans for a workshop to be held at the end of October or early in November, which should be attended by about 30 participants -- our own members, seabed mining experts from industrialized countries, representatives of developing countries, and representatives of the UN Secretariat, UNIDO, IOC, UNEP, and ILO. The workshop should help define the guide lines for a full-scale two-year project.



# Some points for consideration for Pacem in Maribus IX

### Yaounde, January, 1979.

Duration: 1 day opening and general.
3 working days, one devoted each to

- (a) N. Africa and Mediterranean
- (b) West Africa and Atlantic
- (c) East Africa and Indian Ocean.

### Papers to be commissioned:

Not more than five papers each for (a), (b), and (c); 2 general papers for the opening day. Papers should be geared to major interests of (a), (b), and (c) respectively.

Overriding questions: What do African countries gain, and what do they lose through the new Law of the Sea? How can the new Law of the Sea be developed regionally to maximize benefits for African peoples? How can the development of marine resources and ocean management be integrated into a general development strategy for Africa, in the framework of a new international economic order?

Some papers might be organized around the following clusters of subjects:

# (a) N. Africa and Mediterranean

- (i) Lines of possible regional cooperation on matters mentioned in the ICNT (enclosed/semi-enclosed seas);
- (ii) Mediterranean fisheries: survey plus analysis of conservation measures required. Africa and the Blue Plan.
- (iii) Shipping and development of national shipping lines.

  Would it be useful and feasible were two or more

  Mediterranean countries to establish a common shipping
  line? African countries and the UNCTAD Code of Conduct
  for Liner Conferences.
  - (iv) impact of emerging law of the sea in Mediterranean.
