





There are numerous organizations at Dalhousie that offer the student body a variety of opportunities to pursue personal interests. From time to time the DISPATCH will try to present an inside view of what could be what you want to get involved with.

Recently, the director of the Photography Department of the Student Union, Paull Grandy, was asked a few questions about the department's role at Dal.

DISPATCH: WHAT EXACTLY DOES THE PHOTOGRAPHY DEPARTMENT OF THE STUDENT UNION HAVE TO OFFER DAL STUDENTS?

PAULL: The Photo Dept. of the DSU, Dal Photo, offers students the opportunity to learn photography from people who have been involved in scholastic photojournalism for a number of years, and to have their photos published in the yearbook and various student newspapers-primarily the Gazette.

The department also operates a camera club where students gain personal use of the darkroom for a small fee.

It's a place to meet people, have fun, work hard and learn.

DISPATCH: WHAT KIND OF EXPERIENCE IS NECESSARY IN ORDER TO GET INVOLVED? IF YOU'R NOT A PRO , WHAT THEN?

PAULL: There's no experience necessary to join Dal Photo. We offer workshops to our new members who learn everything from pushing the button to making the print.

Of course, in addition to the formal instruction there's always the opportunity to ask questions about our work. There are no experts; we learn from each other. In a few months time, I suspect our new members will have things to teach me.

DISPATCH: HOW MUCH TIME WOULD ONE HAVE TO DEVOTE TO DAL PHOTO, IS THERE A BIG WORKLOAD?

PAULL: The amount of time spent working on assignments is really up to the individual. I've seen some people spend more time here than they do sleeping, but really, it only takes a couple of hours a week to be an active member.

DISPATCH: WHAT SHOULD SOMEONE DO IN ORDER TO GET INVOLVED OR FIND OUT MORE?

PAULL: We're in room 320 of the SUB if anyone wants to drop by. Whether you want to join or you're just curious there's usually someone here that would be more than happy to answer questions.
