Monday Aug 27 Fine morning, rained in the afternoon. Paid Burns and let him go. Peter went to Brule with the mare, did not want pay for the day.

Tuesday

Aug. 28 Fine morning, as the day advanced began to look like rain. Peter went to Bill Hickey's in the afternoon took some wheat to Purdy's and had it cleaned.

Wednesday Aug. 29 Cloudy morning. Jim Chambers began to mend harness. Peter not doing anything, going out to Richmond.

Thursday Aug. 30 Fine morning. Peter getting a grist ready for the mill. Florence drove me to Wallace I started for P.E. Island.

Friday

Aug 31 Fine morning. Peter went to McKay's Mill
Waugh's River, got back about nine Oclock. I got to ch-town
at 11 Oclock last night, went to church this morning.
My first in the new Cathedral it is a magnificient
building. I, in company with Mrs. Canfield and Miss
Wigginston went to Crapaud in the afternoon.

Saturday Sept 1st Fine morning. Left Tryone at 6 Oclock this morning in company with Miss Wigginston (Mrs. Canfield stayed behind) and drove nearly five miles to get the steamer for Ch-town. Left the wharf at Crapaud 7 A.M. lovely morning to sail along the coast and see the beautiful residences and farms. Arrived at ch-town 10:30 A.M. I went across the ferry to South Port to see the boys. they were just unloaded in about an hour they came to plank wharf we hustled and got thing(s) on board and at 4PM we made sail for Wallace. off Oak-Island a little after dark and then the wind died out. We drifted in with the tide and light puffs of wind until we reached near the ballast wharf. were compelled to drop anchor to keep ourselves afloat. All the boys except the Cpt. & myself took the boat 108 and went ashore. it was now midnight.

Sunday

Sept. 2nd Cloudy morning. the Capt. and I got the vessel under way and tried to get up to the stone wharf wind very light and ahead, tide going out, had to drop anchor below the wharf and go ashore in the boat. Went to R.

B. Canfields and got my breakfast. Jimmy drove me home.

Sept. 3rd Fine morning. Peter went with uncle Roly to put in grain, in the afternoon went to a meeting of the party at Neil Sutherlands. when I came home I met Kate

and Allie just home from Truro. I also learned of Monday the accident that happened to them and Walker at David Roberts bridge. Shortly after I arrived home Dr. Walker and Lena came, thus relieving the anxiety 109 for their safety. Sept 4th Beautiful morning. Peter putting out compost, Tuesday going to Uncle Rory's in the afternoon to put in the grain. Dr. Walker and I went to see about his waggon, the pole was broken. When we got and seen the place where they tumbled into it is a mystery to me how they escaped without having some of their limbs broken. it was a clear case of negligence on the part of the commissioners not having properly guarded the cut, also 110 not having a light on it. Sept. 5th Fine morning. Peter putting out compost. Wednesday Dr. Walk(er) getting ready to go home. the commissioner took his wagon and got it repaired and fectched it to him this morning. Peter got the horse and waggon 110 1/2 and went to Coles this afternoon. Thursday Sept. 6th Fine day, Peter busy about the farm. 111 1/2 Friday Sept. 7 Fine day. Peter cut some wheat. 112 1/2 Sept 8th Beautiful day. Peter busy about the farm. Saturday Peter and I went to D. Mcfernald's Funeral. 113 Sunday Sept 9th Fine day, the wife, Kate and Florence took a drive to the church at the cross roads, it being Mr. Frame's Sacrement Sunday. From the church they went to Charles McLeods for their dinner. Came home about 3 p.m. Annie Woodlock and a Miss Borden were here for tea. X Sept. 10th Fine morning. Peter (and) I working about Monday 114 the farm. Tuesday Sept 11th Rainy morning, cleared at noon. Uncle Roly, Peter and I mowed wheat over by Frank's line. 115 Sept. 12th Dark morning, Came out fine. Peter, Jim Wednesday Chambers and I put in wheat by the house. Peter went over to Cavanagh's to go to Halifax Exhibition. 116 Thursday Sept. 13th Fine morning. Peter away to exhibition. 116

Sept 14th Fine morning. got Frank Kirwin and his boy, Firday Uncle Rory, Jim Chambers and myself and put in the 116 wheat by the line. Peter not home. Sept 15th Fine morning. Peter came home last night, Saturday 117 went to work this morning. 16th Sept. Fine day. Sunday Monday Sept 17th Peter on the Farm. 118 Tuesday Sept. 18 Peter on the Farm. 119 Wednesday Sept 19th Peter on the Farm. 120 Thursday Sept 20th Cloudy morning, Peter on the Farm. 121 Mrs. McKay to the Station. Thursday Sept 27th Foggey in the morning. Cleared about 9 O'clock. Uncle Rory came with his oxen and cart & we put in 5 127 loads of oats. 28th Rained last night, raining in the morning. Could Friday not put in any oats to day. Peter and I hauled seaweed until near dinner time and then Peter went to John D. McKenzie's for a calf I bought at the sale. 128 Peter chopped wood all the afternoon and I was dodging

around.

Sept. 29th Morning begins clear with a very heavy Saturday dew. Peter, Jim Walsh and I go over to Alex Cunningham's for the big steers that are troubling Alex - got home about ten Oclock and began to gather grain. Put in three loads. Kate and Florence went to Wallace after tea. 129 Sept 30th Very cloudy in the morning and very warm, Sunday fine rain in the afternoon. I was herding cattle in the shore fields. R. S. Flinn came here in the evening. Oct 1st Fine morning. Peter hauling sea-weed of the shore Monday 130 Oct 2nd Fine day. Peter carting, in the morning, Tuesday 130 cutting barley in the afternoon. Oct 3rd Fine day. Peter and I were cutting barley, in Wednesday the forenoon I went down to D. G. McKenzie's and got a lamb to kill. About four Oclock D. G. and I went to Archibald's on the Grant to make out some papers to have his son become a British subject, he having been born in the United States of America, had our tea there. After tea we went to the Hall at Rany's Corner to hear Mr. Cahon speak. I brought Mr. Cahon home with me as he was going to speak at North Shore Hall on 131 Thursday evening the 4th inst. Oct. 4th Fine day. Peter digging potatoes. I took Mr. Thursday Cahon up to Uncle Pat's, after that drove him over to the Stake and up the ridge, got home at dinner time. After dinner took him down to D.G. and he drove him around Malagash. had a fine meeting, big crowd 132 Mr. Cahon came home with me. Oct 5th Rainy morning Peter not feeling very well did Friday not work today. I took Mr. Cahon down to D.G. and he drove him over to South Shore and then to Wallace, he was to speak at head of Wallace Bay. Raining heavily. 132 Saturday Oct 6th Cloudy rainy morning. Peter threshing grassseed, in the afternoon went up to the Corner St(ore), got fine after dinner. Kate, Florence and I drove to Pugwash to hear Sir Charles Tupper and Mr. Cahon speak, there was an immense lot of people, some say 2500 others say 3000. it was a great meeting for Pugwash. I stayed all night Kate and I came home on Sunday. Florence stayed behind. it was a beautiful day 132 1/2 R. S. Flinn was here in the evening.

Sunday Oct 7th Beautiful fine day. Came home from Pugwash, left Florence behind. 'R. S. Flinn came in the evening. Monday Oct 8th Fine sunny day. Peter digging potatoes in the morning, I was turning the buckwheat and barley; 133 1/2 afternoon we put in the barley by the house. Oct 9th Rainy morning much to my regret. Peter and Tuesday I finished threshing grass-seed. raining heavily 134 hurting buckwheat and barley. Wednesday Oct. 10th Still raining cant do anything 134 Oct 11th Still raining in torrents, greatest rain for Thursday a number of years, blew a very strong breeze of wind about dark from the North East. Peter and Lena were 134 1/2 at the corner. Friday Oct 12th Rain ceasing. Peter and I cleaning out pig pen went to the woods for poles for the floor, getting 135 1/2 fine in the afternoon. Oct 13th Beautiful morning. Peter and I began digging Saturday potatoes, in the morning about ten Oclock turned buckwheat and barley, found it in a very bad state, growing quite a bit. in the afternoon put in a small load of 136 1/2 barley in bad order. Oct. 14th Quiet morning, looking like rain. Peter Sunday went away, was away all day. began to rain about 4 p.m. I was herding the cattle when it was raining. X Oct. 15th Rainy morning nothing doing in the afternoon Monday the wife and I went to Murray Carlisle's to see the corpse of David King, he having died yesterday, Sunday, at the advanced age of nearly eighty-six years. 136 1/2 Oct. 16th Fine morning, too wet to do anything on Tuesday the land to day. Peter got the horse and waggon and went to Richmond. this is the anniversary of the death of my brother Michael, he is 36 years dead to day. Wednesday Oct 17th rainy morning. Peter carting manure out of 137 the dung space, made half a day. Oct. 18th Fine morning. turned the buckwheat and Thursday barley in the morning and put it in in the afternoon. 138 Friday Oct. 19th rainy morning. David King buried today. Mr. Cohan speaks in Wallace tonight. Peter and I 139 went to hear him.

Saturday Oct. 20th Cloudy. Peter and I getting wood out of the brook. Dr. Walsh coming this evening.

Sunday

Oct. 21st rainy morning. Church on the ridge this morning. Very wet and muddy, got fine in the afternoon.

X Went to Rory's and Daniels in the evening.

Monday

22nd Very fine morning. Sam Langille came to help us to dig potatoes. Peter & Sam dug all the forenoon, in the afternoon Peter went to the wedding. Maggie Carty was married to Thomas MacGar(v)ill of Pictou. Florence went for Sam's two boys and in the afternoon we picked

140 1/2 95 bush(els) of potatoes.

Oct. 23rd Beautiful fine morning. Peter went to the station with Mrs. MacGarvill's house hold goods. Sam Langille digging potatoes. Peter got back about 10 Oclock. Sam's boys came in the afternoon and we finished 141 1/4 digging.

Wednesday Oct. 24th Fine nice morning. Peter began to plough, he ploughed potato land for next spring. I raked the barley land.

Thursday

Oct. 25th Fine morning. Peter and I got a grist ready for the mill. Sent 11 bush - wheat, 6 1/2 Buckwheat and 4 bush- barley. Peter took the wheat to Purdy's & got it cleaned, going to get his grist on Saturday.

Friday

Oct 26th Fine morning. Peter and I went to the shore and got three loads of very good rock weed. Came home about two Oclock and began to pull turnips. pulled about seventy bushels. Elder John McKenzie's wife was buried yesterday. She was a Baillie, aged nearly eighty years.

Peter, the hired man, is believed to be Peter Hickey and he never married. Note that on at least two occasions he was not paid when he took the horse to the blacksmith shop to be shod, because the blacksmith was away. Also on May 30 and May 31 although he worked both days he was only credited with one, and again on Oct. 1 & Oct. 2, the same thing occured. He also lost 1/2 day on July 9th and again on Sept. 8th when he attended a funeral in the community.

The writer of the diary is Zabud MacKey who apparently lived on the Mortinson farm, to the west of McLean's on McLean's Hill, Malagash North Shore. He was a liberal minded Catholic and appars to have been a Justice of the Peace. His wife may have been a Protestant. He appears to have taken a great interest not only in politics but also in all community matters. He was an ardent Conservative. He is buried in the Roman Catholic cemetery on Wallace Ridge and the gravestone inscription reads:

As his wife is not mentioned she may have been buried in some other cemetery.
