Rain Location: 2nd floor Foyer-Cumming Hall

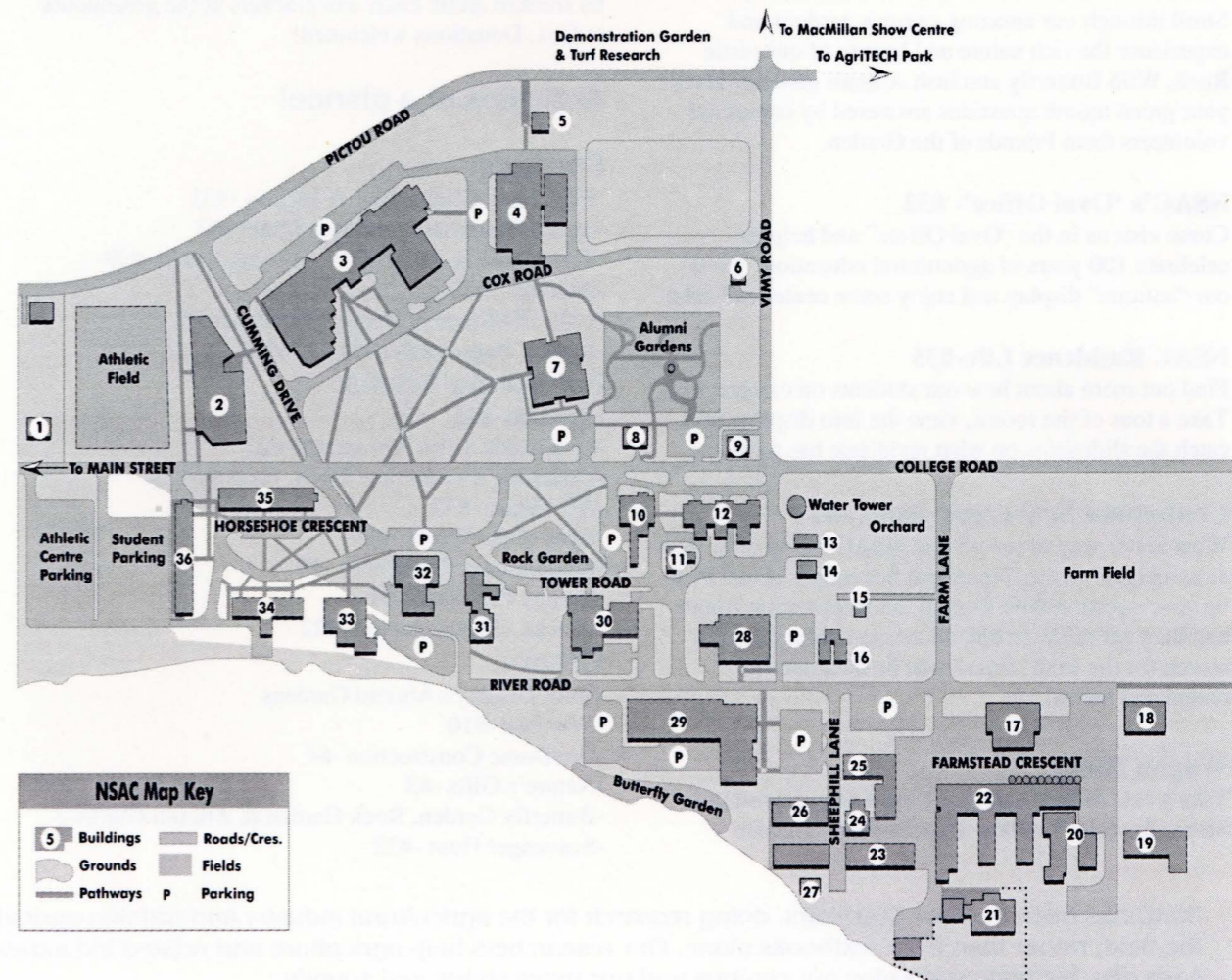
